Proclamation "Walk to D'Feet ALS" September 18, 2005

Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), also known as "Lou Gehrig's Disease" is a progressive disease that attacks nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord of which an estimated 30,000 Americans have the disease at any given time. On September 18, 2005, a "Walk to D'Feet ALS" will be held at Eagle Scout Park at 2:00 p.m. to raise funds to find a cure and to assist those afflicted with the disease. The Mayor has proclaimed September 18, 2005 as "Walk to D'Feet ALS" and encourages all citizens to support the walk. See attached PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), often referred to as “Lou Gehrig’s Disease,” is a progressive neurodegeneration disease that attacks nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord; and
- WHEREAS, based on U.S. population studies, a little over 5,600 people in the U.S. are diagnosed with ALS each year. (That’s 15 new cases a day.); and
- WHEREAS, it is estimated that as many as 30,000 Americans have the disease at any given time and a number in Central Nebraska; and
- WHEREAS, on September 18, 2005 a “Walk to D’Feet ALS” will be held at Eagle Scout Park at 2:00 p.m. to raise funds to find a cure and to assist those afflicted with the disease.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jay Vavricek, Mayor of the City of Grand Island, Nebraska, do hereby proclaim September 18, 2005 as

“WALK TO D’FEET ALS”

in the City of Grand Island, and encourage all citizens to support the Walk to D’Feet ALS and salute those who walk to find a cure for this devastating disease.
