Background

The voters of the City of Grand Island approved an economic development plan at the May 6, 2003 election. Subsequent to the election, the City has adopted an ordinance that establishes the economic development plan and a Citizens' Advisory Review Committee to oversee the process of approving applications for economic development incentives. The Citizens' Advisory Review Committee is required by State Statute and the Grand Island City Code to make a semi-annual report to the City Council.

Discussion

The Citizens Advisory Review Committee has been conducting regular meetings during the last six months as required by the City Code and the Nebraska Statutes. The committee looks forward to receiving and reviewing meritorious applications for consideration in the future. The committee received the semi-annual report from the Economic Development Corporation at its meeting of April 26, 2011, and voted to forward it onto the City Council for its review and acceptance.

The Economic Development Program may include, but shall not be limited to:

- A revolving loan fund for non-retail qualified businesses.
- Grants or agreements for job training
- ➤ Technical Assistance to businesses
- grants or real estate options essential to the location or expansion of a qualifying Public Works improvements and/or purchase of fixed assets including land business.
- Creative and Flexible initiatives to stimulate economic growth
- End Destination Tourism Related Activities
- Development of low to moderate income housing







Types of Businesses that will be Eligible

- proprietorship that derives its principal source of income for any of the following: A qualifying business can be a corporation, partnership, LLC, or sole
- A. Manufacturer of articles of commerce
- Research and Development
- which are sold or traded in interstate commerce as distinguished from C. Processing, storage, transport, or sale of goods or commodities goods offered for sale at retail locally
- D. The sale of services in interstate commerce
- E. Telecommunications
- End Destination Tourism-Related Activities
- Qualifying business must be located within the zoning jurisdiction of the city unless a variance is granted.
- Any other business deemed qualifying through the Legislature.


Wind Power Projects

- Wind Turbines International company for assembly and distribution. Needed a 60 acre site, rail, access to highways and interstate.









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





