The Scottsbluff City Council met in a regular meeting on September 4, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 2525 Circle Drive, Scottsbluff. A notice of the meeting had been published on August 31, 2018, in the Star Herald, a newspaper published and of general circulation in the City. Ms. Sabrina Esparza was recognized by the Council with a plaque for her involvement with cleanup efforts within the City of Scottsbluff. Ms. Esparza has spearheaded and organized a neighborhood committee in southeast Scottsbluff for the last twenty years.

Mayor Meininger opened the public hearing at 6:03 p.m. for authorizing the final tax request for the 2018-2019 year at a different amount than the prior year request. City Manager Johnson explained that the County property tax valuation increased by 1.18% or \$22,402, the levy has not changed and because of this Scottsbluff has the third lowest property tax valuation in the State.

There were no comments from the public. Mayor Meininger closed the public hearing at 6:05 p.m.

Mr. Johnson went over the Resolution for the property tax request. The 2018-2019 property tax request for the City of Scottsbluff is \$1,913,738; the Business Improvement District \$54,100. It was put into motion by Council Member Gonzales, seconded by Council Member Shaver "to approve Resolution No. 18-09-01 setting the final tax request for the 2018-2019 year at a different amount than the prior year request," "YEAS," Shaver, McCarthy, Gonzales, Colwell, and Meininger. "NAYS" None. Absent: None.

RESOLUTION NO. <u>18-09-01</u>

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1601.02 provides that the property tax request for the prior year shall be the property tax request for the current year for purposes of the levy set by the County Board of Equalization unless the Governing Body of the City of Scottsbluff passes by a majority vote a resolution or ordinance setting the tax request at a different amount; and

WHEREAS, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City of Scottsbluff that the property tax request for the current year shall be a different amount than the property tax request for the prior year.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Governing Body of the City of Scottsbluff, by a majority vote, resolves that:

- 1. The 2018-2019 property tax request be set at \$1,913,738 for the City of Scottsbluff.
- 2. The 2018-2019 property tax request be set at \$54,100 for the Business Improvement District.
- 3. A copy of this resolution be certified and forwarded to the County Clerk on or before October 12, 2018.

Mayor Meininger opened the public hearing at 6:07 p.m. for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to the FY 2018-2019 budget. City Manager Johnson explained that the budgeted revenues net of transfers in the amount of \$26,542,634 shows a decrease over the previous year of 2.5 million, which is mainly due to the bond issuance for 42nd Street for the prior fiscal year.

The General Fund revenue for FY19 is \$8,063,604, which is a decrease of \$65,976. The FY19 budgeted sales tax revenue is \$5,455,859 decreased by 4%, at \$227,328. The Budgeted Property Tax revenue for FY19 is an increase of \$22,402 due to Scotts Bluff County valuation increases, however the City levy remains the same with a limit of \$175,000 going into the General Fund. The remaining property tax dollars are deposited into a sinking fund for capital expenditures, public safety, cemetery, transportation and debt service. The NPPD Lease Revenues amount is \$2,539,750, which is no change from FY18

The FY19 Budgeted Expenditures is \$43,080,070 which includes capital expenditures of \$6,321,540, debt service \$2,788,259. This is an increase from the previous year of \$1,976,099; mainly due to debt service expenses.

The FY19 Budgeted operating expenses is \$30,102,277 which is an increase from the previous year of \$2,905,138 mainly due to economic development. The General Fund budgeted operating expense is \$11,095,613, which includes a \$250,000 contingency and two million for the pathway expansion. The number of full time employees has remained the same from last year and in the future more is to be allocated into economic development to reinvest in the community.

Ms. Katie Bradshaw asked about the right of way to the Pathway and if that was included in the budget. Mr. Johnson explained that the parks department budget has been increased by two million and therefore that is included.

There were no more comments from the public and Mayor Meininger closed the public hearing at 6:12 p.m.

Mayor Meininger introduced the Ordinance which was read by title on first reading: AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE BUDGET STATEMENT TO BE TERMED THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BILL; TO APPROPRIATE SUMS FOR NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mayor Meininger opened the public hearing at 6:15 p.m. to consider the Class I Liquor License for La Musica, LLC dba El Baile Nightclub. Mr. Jose Carrillo, Manager of El Baile Nightclub, Mr. Susano Morales Lopez, owner of El Baile Nightclub, Police Chief Kevin Spencer, and Ms. Sabrina Esparza, resident were sworn in to testify about the liquor license. Moved by Council Member Shaver, seconded by Council Member McCarthy "that the following exhibits, presented on behalf of the City Council, be entered into the record: 1) La Musica, LLC El Baile Nightclub, Liquor License application; 2) City Council check list for section 53-132 cum supp 2016; 3) written statement of Police Chief Kevin Spencer dated August 31, 2018; 4) written statement of City Clerk dated September 4, 2018; 5) written statement from the Development Services Department dated August 9, 2018; "YEAS," McCarthy, Gonzales, Colwell, Meininger, and Shaver. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Mr. Carrillo explained to Council that he has a plan for his business which will involve everyone in the community. He will require everyone who enters the establishment to wear a wristband, including different bands for minors, marking them with an "M" with permanent marker. He has installed 32 cameras which will be fully functioning at all times and he will be taking, along with all employees, later this month responsible alcohol training. Mayor Meininger asked who would be ordering and have access to the alcohol. Mr. Carrillo stated that would be himself and Mr. Morales Lopez. He also mentioned there are cameras in the area as well. Mr. Carrillo stated he has a zero tolerance policy of selling alcohol to minors, with employees being terminated if they do. Council Member Colwell asked if minors will be allowed in the establishment until closing. Mr. Carrillo stated that they will be allowed as long as they are eighteen, due to curfews. City Attorney Hadenfeldt asked if Mr. Morales Lopez still had a liquor license in Colorado and if there was a purchase agreement on the building, with both questions answered yes by Mr. Carrillo.

Police Chief Spencer reported that he does extensive background checks on all the applicants and there is no criminal history on either of the applicants. He is somewhat impressed with the 32 cameras and the security protocol for the business. He did mention that Mr. Morales Lopez did have a violation on his license in Colorado and the bartender was immediately terminated.

Ms. Sabrina Esparza, resident, commented that it was concerning that minors would be with adults and that it would be too easy for them to get alcohol.

With there being no more comments from the public Mayor Meininger closed the public hearing at 6:28 p.m. Council Member Colwell asked that they reconsider a curfew for the minors. It was put into motion by Council Member Gonzales, seconded by Mayor Meininger "to forward a positive recommendation to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission for La Musica, LLC dba El Baile Nightclub, Class I liquor license pursuant to Nebraska§53-132 (2)a, (2)b, (2)c, and (2)d," "YEAS," Colwell, Meininger, Shaver, Gonzales, McCarthy. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

- 3. Upon consideration of the evidence and the criterion to be considered by the City Council pursuant to law, the City Council finds as follows:
 - Applicant has demonstrated a fitness, willingness, and ability to properly serve or sell liquor in conformance to the rules and regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Act.
 - b. Applicant has met its burden with regard to the check list provided by Section 53-132 R.R.S. (2010) and demonstrates a willingness and ability to properly serve or sell liquor in conformance to the rules and regulations of the Nebraska Liquor Control Act and its management and control appears to be sufficient to insure compliance with such rules and regulations.
- 4. By reason of the above, the Applicant has met the burden of proof and persuasion in producing evidence pertaining to the criterion prescribed in the Nebraska Statutes.Based on the above findings, the City Council approves the application and recommends to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission that a Retail Class I liquor license for La Musica, LLC dba El Baile Nightclub at the premises described in the application.
- 5. The City Clerk shall transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Commission.

Mayor Meininger opened the public hearing at 6:34 p.m. to consider a zone change for 1116 Avenue C from R-1A, single family to C-2 neighborhood and retail commercial zone. Mr. Johnson stated to Council the planning commission has unanimously approved this request and Mr. Rick Wayman, owner of the property, came forward and explained that he would like to remove an unsafe structure and put a comm shop on the property, hence the rezone.

Mayor Meininger closed the public hearing at 6:36 p.m. It was put into motion by Mayor Meininger and seconded by Council Member Gonzales "to direct legal counsel to write an Ordinance to authorize the rezone of the property," "YEAS," Gonzales, Colwell, Meininger, Shaver, and McCarthy. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Mr. Bill Winburg, Director of Operations of RMH Franchise Corporation, dba Applebee's was in attendance, due to the absence of manager applicant Jennifer Hansen. Ms. Hansen had a prior travel commitment and could not make the meeting, but wrote a letter explaining her responsibilities as the liquor license manager, which Mr. Winburg read. Ms. Hansen explained in her letter that RMH has decided to move all liquor licenses in the State of Nebraska, due to the absence of the Director of Risk, into her name. She explained that if any location fails a compliance check the person(s) involved will be immediately terminated and the staff retrained. All new hires will undergo responsible alcohol training and staff will have annual training. They will keep all invoices on site and will deliver proper notification posters in the establishment. Council Member Shaver asked if Ms. Hansen would ever be at the location. Mr. Winburg explained that the Director of Risk has always had the license in their name and Ms. Hansen will be at the store periodically, but Mr. Winburg will have the physical presence at the establishment. Mayor Meininger, seconded by Council Member Colwell made a motion "to forward a positive recommendation to the Nebraska Liquor License Commission naming Jennifer L. Hansen as the manager of RMH Franchise Corporation, dba Applebee's Neighborhood Bar & Grill," "YEAS," Meininger, Shaver, McCarthy, Gonzales, and Colwell. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Regarding the Ordinance on updating utility user fees, including water and sewer fees, solid waste collection and surcharge for storm water, Council introduced the Ordinance that was read by title on second reading: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSBLUFF AMENDING SEWER USER FEES AT CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 6, INCLUDING SURCHARGE FOR STORMWATER REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS, AMENDING AND CHANGING THE SOLID WASTE COLLECTION FEES AT CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 6, AND WATER SERVICE FEES AT

CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 6, REPEALING PRIOR PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mayor Meininer asked if anyone had any comments on the Ordinances, with Council Member Shaver asking for red letter versions to see the changes made.

Regarding the Ordinance on updating the use of special collections and additional containers, Council introduced the Ordinance which was read by title on second reading: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSBLUFF AMENDING CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 6, INCLUDING SPECIAL COLLECTIONS AND ADDITIONAL CONTAINERS REPEALING PRIOR PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Council Member McCarthy introduced the Ordinance charging fees for inbound and outbound materials at the compost facility, which was read by title on first reading: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSBLUFF DEALING WITH DISPOSAL OF TREES, BRUSH AND YARD WASTE AT CITY DISPOSAL SITES, AMENDING THE SCOTTSBLUFF MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 6-6-26, EXEMPTING YARD WASTE AND TREE DISPOSAL FROM A CITIZEN'S RESIDENCE, SETTING FORTH RATES AND CHARGES FOR ACCEPTING COMMERCIAL AND NON-RESIDENTIAL YARD WASTE AND TREE DISPOSAL, REPEALING THE FORMER SECTION, PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Manager Johnson reported that the City has received the revised 90% plans and the right of way cost estimate for the Monument Valley Pathway North Project. This phase of the project is an 80-20 split between the City and the State, with the City's portion being \$201,200. This is more than the \$40,000 that was originally budgeted in previous years, but the City has budgeted in FY 19 for the increase. It was put into motion by Mayor Meininger and seconded by Council Member Colwell "to approve Resolution No. 18-09-03 for the revised 90% plans and right of way cost estimate for the Monument Valley Pathway North Project," "YEAS," Colwell, Meininger, McCarthy, and Gonzales. "NAYS," Shaver. Absent: None.

Regarding the request for the advertising of a proposal for sanitation services, City Manager Johnson explained to Council that this is not due to any public testimony, but is due to the City trying to get data to make an informed and educated decision. The RFP covers three options 1). Privatize all sanitation services. 2). Keep existing sanitation services, but use a transfer station or landfill. 3). The public or a private entity can submit an alternate proposal. He reiterated the City would like to measure services and make sure those services are cost effective in all areas, with Mayor Meininger asking if the RFP includes roll offs, which it does.

Mr. Bobby Allbaugh addressed Council and thanked them for being open minded and looking at all options, including the private sector.

Mayor Meininger, seconded by Council Member Shaver made a motion "to approve the advertising of a Request for Proposal for sanitation services," "YEAS," Shaver, McCarthy, Gonzales, Colwell, and Meininer. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Mr. Johnson introduced an engineering agreement with Trihydro to review five potential landfill sites, the amount being \$264,512, which will come out of the joint sinking fund with the City of Gering.

Mr. Bobby Allbaugh approached Council and stressed he is still fearful and hopes multiple sites will be looked at. He questioned why 88 out 113 landfills show contamination in the Wyoming area and asked Council if the five sites looked at will be on different properties. Ms. Marge Bedessem of Trihydro Corporation explained that the 88 facilities are small and have been in existence for many years and they should not impact the decision making for the new state of the art facilities. She stressed having transparency and good communication throughout the process while looking at many different sites.

Mayor Meininger made a motion, seconded by Council Member Shaver "to approve an engineer for Step 1, in connection with the siting of a municipal solid waste facility with the City of Gering, contingent on Gering approving the agreement and payment to come out of the joint sinking fund between the two cities," "YEAS," McCarthy, Gonzales, Colwell, Meininger, and Shaver. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Mr. Johnson introduced the amended fire contract which is due to the pay resolution being approved at a previous council meeting. It includes wages, a promotional position of lieutenant and an added step 8. Council Member Shaver, seconded by Council Member Colwell made a motion "to approve the amended Fire Contract Article VIII Wages," "YEAS," Gonzales, Colwell, Meininger, Shaver, and McCarthy. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Regarding the amended police contract referring to Article XXII wages, this is a one percent increase across the board to keep Police Officers, Corporals, and Sergeants in line with the array, as identified by the Commission of Industrial Relations, to be between 98 and 102. Council Member Shaver, seconded by Council Member McCarthy made a motion "to approve amended Police Contract Article XXII Wages," "YEAS," Meininger, Shaver, McCarthy, Gonzales, and Colwell. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Mr. Johnson explained to Council that during the annual inspection of the wastewater treatment facility and the water system, the City received a directive from The Department of Health and Human Services that they cannot have cross connection between our potable water and sludge pump. As a result of this, an agreement was made with the North Platte NRD and Minatare Mutual Canal & Irrigation Company that allows the City to install a non-potable well for \$10,575. The money will come from the wastewater fund and will ensure there is no cross connection. Mayor Meininger made the motion, seconded by Council Member Shaver "to approve an agreement with the North Platte NRD and Minatare Mutual Canal & Irrigation Company that mitigates water use associated with the installation of a small water well for the Wastewater Treatment Plant process and authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement," "YEAS," Gonzales, Colwell, Meininger, Shaver, and McCarthy. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Mr. Johnson introduced a flag football agreement with Kirk Bernhardt as coordinator. Teams will have a sign- up fee of \$300.00 and there are twenty teams interested, which will cover the payment to Mr. Bernhardt of \$1,000.00. Council Member Colwell asked about age limits and this league is for adults only. Council Member McCarthy asked about liability to the City; the contract states each participant will sign a waiver. Council Member McCarthy, seconded by Council Member Shaver made a motion "to approve an agreement with Kirk Bernhardt as the Flag Football Coordinator and authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement," "YEAS," Meininger, Shaver, McCarthy, Gonzales, and Colwell. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

There were no comments from the public. Mayor Meininger reminded everyone that Zuercher goes online October 23rd and the Senior Center meeting is September 11th. He also acknowledged the nursing students in attendance who explained they are attending meetings to satisfy a class they are taking, which requires them to write a paper on how the meeting agenda relates to nursing.

It was put into motion by Council Member Shaver, seconded by Council Member Colwell "to adjourn the meeting at 7:19 p.m.," "YEAS," Shaver, McCarthy, Gonzales, Meininger, and Colwell. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Item 7: The Planning Commission opened the public hearing for a request from property owner(s) Western Sugar Company for a Preliminary Plat of Lot 1, Block 1, Western Addition. Situated in the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 19, Township 22 North, Range 54 West of the 6th P.M., Scottsbluff Bluff County, Nebraska. The property is 5.00 acres currently located within the extra territorial. Access to the property is to be from East Overland. The property has water service located on East Overland as well as Storm Sewer located on East Overland. Sanitary sewer is located on the east side of Highway 26 but can be reached by boring under the highway after the State Department of Roads gives permission to do so. The property is currently zoned as M1, with no setback requirements

for the front, rear, side or side streets. There are no square footage requirements, with the only restriction of 75 feet height limit. The new owner buying the property from Western Sugar will be responsible for a Developers Agreement and Storm Water retention.

Also in attendance were Kevin Sullivan of MC Schaff (surveyor), Jerry Darnell (Western Sugar representative) and Eric Reichert prospective buyer of the 5.00 acres.

After the above information was given to the Planning Commission, the Chairman Angie Aguallo asked if anyone had questions.

Kevin Sullivan approached the podium and advised the members that he did the survey and the property was being parceled for sale to Eric Reichert. Dennis asked the members if they had questions.

Linda Redfern asked if the property had any other locations it could be accessed from Highway 26, Dennis said it could only accessed from East Overland, he did show the members that there was a farm access for the remaining property from HWY.26, but that point was further north of these 5.00 acres.

Henry Huber asked Eric Reichert what he had planned for the location and Eric stated a convenience store. Gary Batt added that a convenience store with fuel sales is allowed in an M1 zone.

Chairman Aguallo asked if there were any other questions, there were none and she asked for a motion.

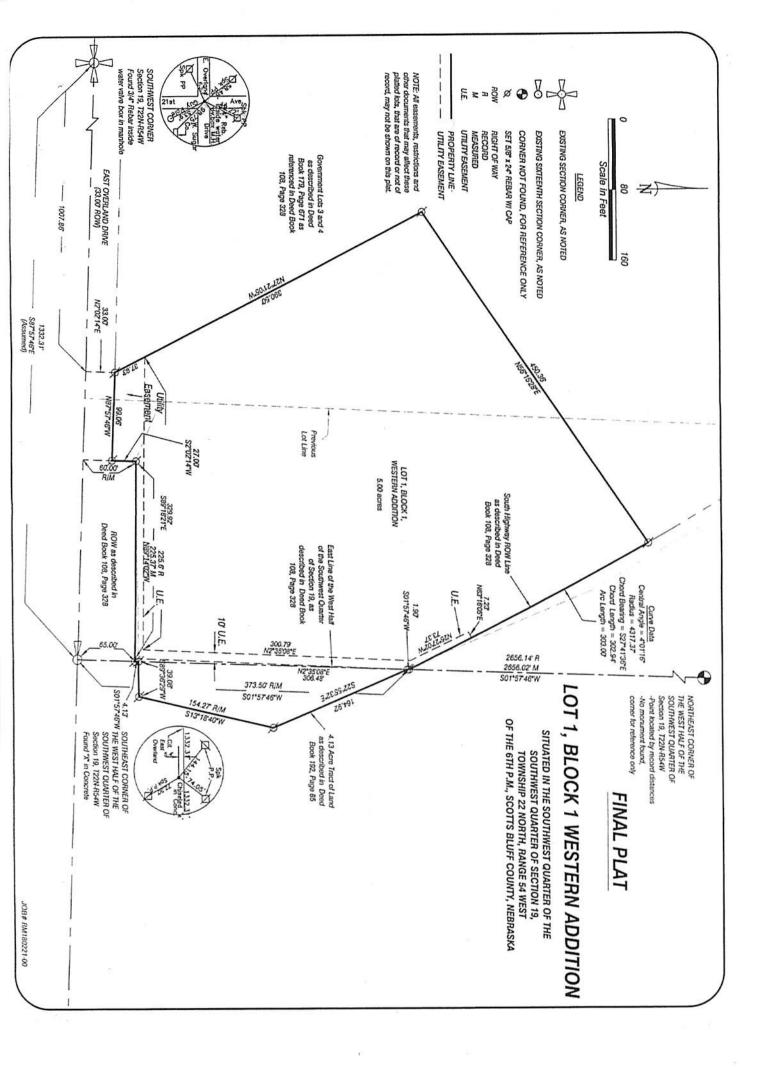

6-6-24. Institutional; business; commercial; industrial.

(a) The monthly charges for collection and disposal of solid waste of institutional, business, commercial and industrial establishments, and solid waste in required containers at construction sites, shall be based upon the number of approved containers collected per collection. Where an establishment has its own water or sewer connection, the fact that it shares a building with another establishment, or does not occupy the entire building, shall be of no significance. The charge per approved container per collection shall be as follows:

If the volume of solid waste as estimated by the representative of the Sanitation Department exceeds to capacity of a standard ½ ton pickup truck, the charge shall be \$31.00 for each pickup load. - 1. Customers recycling electronic waste including but not limited to: electronic mice, printers, fax machines, scanners, electronic typewriters, keyboards, computer speakers, servers, hard drives, television sets, VCR/DVD/Blue Ray players, home or auto stereo equipment, small electronics, gaming equipment and CFL light bulbs and florescent tubes brought in for disposal, shall be charged a fee of \$.50 per pound for all electronic waste brought in for recycling.
- For computer monitors, desk top and laptop computers brought in by any customer, including residential and non-residential customers, \$5 per monitor or desk top or laptop computer.
- 3. For non-recyclable appliances and electronic equipment, every person including residential and non-residential customers, who shall dispose of an appliance or non-recyclable electronic equipment at any disposal site of the City shall pay a charge of \$26.00 per item disposed.
- 4. The fee for the Gaylord (cardboard) containers shall be \$20.00 per month.
- 5. The rates and fees provided in this section shall be effective after October 1, 2018."

Section 2. Previously existing Section 6-6-26.1 of the Scottsbluff Municipal Code and all other Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed. Each user shall pay an additional charge of \$3.19 per each 1,000 gallons of water consumed in excess of 10,000 gallons during the applicable billing period. Provided, however, wholesale users shall pay 92.5% of the charges provided in this paragraph.

- (2) Single-family residential users within the city limits shall pay \$52.80 per bimonthly period.

- (4) Multi-family residential users shall pay \$76.01 per dwelling unit per bimonthly period.

6-6-21. Mobile tanks.

Users who discharge from mobile tanks into the City's sanitary sewer system at a point provided for that purpose at the wastewater treatment plant shall be charged the following fees:

- (a) Where the discharge is of normal domestic sewage as defined in this Chapter, and the user discharges less than 100 gallons during a calendar month, there shall be no charge.
- (b) Where the discharge is of normal domestic sewage and the user discharges 100 gallons or more during a calendar month the charge shall be \$5.00 for the first 100 gallons and \$2.00 for each 100 gallons or fraction thereof thereafter.
- (c) Where the discharge is not of normal domestic sewage the charge shall be \$5.00 for each 100 gallons or fraction thereof.



6-6-22. Surcharge. \$3,000

- (1) There will be a \$2.50 per billing cycle surcharge fee to all residents of the city for stormwater regulatory requirements and the use, upkeep and maintenance of the city's stormwater collection system.
- (2) Users who contribute wastewater the strength of which is greater than normal domestic sewage shall, in addition to the basic sewer charge, pay a surcharge equal to \$0.32 per pound for the first ten thousand (10,000) pounds of excess B.O.D. per billing cycle (or up to the limit of their contract with the City), and a surcharge of \$1.05 for all additional excess B.O.D. per billing cycle. A contribution of more than twelve thousand (12,000) pounds of excess B.O.D. per billing cycle, in the absence of a contract, shall subject the user to the sanctions and penalties provided in this Chapter. Users with a contract who exceed the limits of their contract may also be subject to the sanctions and penalties provided in this Chapter.

- (3) Users who contribute wastewater the strength of which is greater than normal domestic sewage shall, in addition to the basic sewer charge, pay a surcharge equal to \$0.06 per pound of excess suspended solids per billing cycle.
- The expression "per billing cycle" as used in this section means the period for which the (4)sewer service charge is payable.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSBLUFF AMENDING SEWER USER FEES AT CHAPTER 6 ARTICLE 6, INCLUDING SURCHARGE FOR STORMWATER REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS, AMENDING AND CHANGING THE SOLID WASTE COLLECTION FEES AT CHAPTER 6 ARTICLE 6, AND WATER SERVICE FEES AT CHAPTER 6 ARTICLE 6, REPEALING PRIOR PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSBLUFF, NEBRASKA.

Section 1. Section 6-6-19 of the Scottsbluff Municipal Code is amended to provide as follows: **6-6-19. Minimum charge.**

Each user shall pay a sewer service charge in the minimum amount of \$44.44 which shall cover the first 10,000 gallons of water consumed by the user during the bimonthly billing period as determined in Chapter 18. Each user shall pay an additional charge of \$3.29 per each 1,000 gallons of water consumed in excess of 10,000 gallons during the applicable billing period. Provided, however, wholesale users shall pay 92.5% of the charges provided in this paragraph.

The rates and fees provided for in this section shall be effective with respect to all connections, installations and billings after December 28, 2018.

Section 2. Section 6-6-20 of the Scottsbluff Municipal Code is amended to provide as follows: **6-6-20. Private water supply.**

With respect to users having a private water supply which is discharged into the City's sanitary sewer system, sewer service charges shall be calculated as follows:

- (1) Commercial and industrial users shall meter their water supply at their expense and their sanitary sewer use charge shall be based on the quantity of water consumed on the premises from all sources.
- (2) Single-family residential users within the city limits shall pay \$54.39 per bimonthly period.
- (3) Single-family residential users outside the city limits shall pay \$91.06 per bimonthly period.
- (4) Multi-family residential users shall pay \$78.29 per dwelling unit per bimonthly period.

The rates and fees provided for in this section shall be effective with respect to all connections, installations and billings after December 28, 2018.

Section 3. Section 6-6-22 of the Scottsbluff Municipal Code is amended to provide as follows: **6-6-22. Surcharge.**

- (1) There will be a \$3.00 per billing cycle surcharge fee to all residents of the city for stormwater regulatory requirements and the use, upkeep and maintenance of the city's stormwater collection system.
- (2) Users who contribute wastewater the strength of which is greater than normal domestic sewage shall, in addition to the basic sewer charge, pay a surcharge equal to \$0.54 per pound for the first ten thousand (10,000) pounds of excess B.O.D. per billing cycle (or up to the limit of their contract with the City), and a surcharge of \$1.08 for all additional excess B.O.D. per billing cycle. A contribution of more than twelve thousand (12,000) pounds of excess B.O.D. per billing cycle, in the absence of a contract, shall subject the user to the sanctions and penalties provided in this Chapter. Users with a contract who exceed the limits of their contract may also be subject to the sanctions and penalties provided in this Chapter.
- (3) Users who contribute wastewater the strength of which is greater than normal domestic sewage shall, in addition to the basic sewer charge, pay a surcharge equal to \$0.06 per pound of excess suspended solids per billing cycle.
- (4) The expression "per billing cycle" as used in this section means the period for which the sewer service charge is payable.
- (5) The rates and fees provided in this section shall be effective with respect to connections, installations and billings after December 28, 2018.

Section 4. Section 6-6-23 of the Scottsbluff Municipal Code is amended to provide as follows: **6-6-23. Residential.**

The minimum bimonthly charges for collection and disposal service to residential units for solid waste and the single stream recycling program all of which is contained in approved containers shall be as follows, effective for all billings made after December 28, 2018:

This year's contract is made on behalf of Tri-City Stormwater, the stormwater education and outreach partnership between Gering, Scottsbluff, and Terrytown, instead of identical separate agreements with each municipality.

CONTRACT

This contract is made this day of ,2018 between Tri-City Stormwater, a cooperative of municipal corporations, and Keep Scottsbluff/Gering Beautiful, a Nebraska non-profit organization, hereafter called "KSGB."

- There are approximately 2,635 (2,300 Scottsbluff + 300 Gering + 35 Terrytown) total catch basins associated with the Scottsbluff, Gering, and Terrytown ("cities") stormwater systems. KSGB agrees to put the words "No Dumping" to be painted, stenciled or decaled on the curb immediately adjacent to each of such catch basins. KSGB may at its option accompany these words with an appropriate logo or phrase to be approved by Tri-City Stormwater.
- KSGB will distribute door hangers, or other materials, explaining the purpose of drain marking and pollution in stormwater runoff. The design and content should be approved by both organizations.
- KSGB agrees to continue to monitor the painted or stenciled area to ensure that the wording and logo remains legible, making any necessary repairs, throughout the duration of this contract.
- KSGB agrees to conduct inspections of the catch basin structures and submit the results of these
 inspections along with progress reports to Tri-City Stormwater for each city's respective
 stormwater programs.
- 5. KSGB agrees to incorporate in its public education program a discussion of the dangers associated with the pollution of the cities' stormwater systems and a description of the corrective actions taken by the cities.
- 6. It is contemplated and agreeable to Tri-City Stormwater that the actual work will be performed by various community service groups under arrangements between such groups and KSGB. Provided, neither Tri-City Stormwater nor its cooperative municipal partners shall be liable or responsible for any injuries or damages resulting from the actual work involved. In addition, KSGB agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Tri-City Stormwater from any claims or causes of action resulting from the actual work performed under this Contract.
- 7. The cities agree to have their GIS Departments provide KSGB with a city map showing the location of the catch basins involved in this contract. The map will identify which catch basins are to be serviced by KSGB in each year of this contract.
- 8. Tri-City Stormwater agrees to provide all supplies reasonably required by KSGB to carry out it's responsibilities under this contract including but not limited to paint, stencils, curb and gutter cleaning supplies, decals, safety vests, educational brochures and materials. Tri-City Stormwater

will consult with KSGB before acquiring the supplies to be furnished. Tri-City Stormwater is not obligated to provide office supplies for KSGB's administrative functions.

9. On behalf of Tri-City Stormwater, the Cities of Gering, Scottsbluff and Terrytown will each pay to KSGB the respective sums on October 1st of each year beginning October 1, 2019 through October 1, 2021. KSGB will annually submit a documented statement of supply costs to Tri-City Stormwater. Documentation shall consist of paid receipts or similar verification of expenditures.

a. Gering: \$4,000 plus supplies not to exceed \$6,000 annually

b. Scottsbluff: \$5,500 plus supplies not to exceed \$8,000 annually

c. Terrytown: \$2,000 plus supplies not to exceed \$4,000 annually

- 10. If KSGB is unable to obtain sufficient proposals from community service organizations at any time during the term of this contact, it will so inform Tri-City Stormwater in writing and the contract shall become null and void, with neither party obligated to the other from the date of the written notice.
- 11. KSGB agrees to make a written progress report to Tri-City Stormwater on an annual basis by March 1st for the previous calendar year. This progress reports shall include the approximate number of catch basins marked in each community as well as the number of non-point source pollution presentations given and the audiences reached.
- 12. It is understood that the sums described in this contract are in addition to any grants or donations currently given or committed by the cities to KSGB for any of KSGB's other community improvement activities.
- 13. The term of this contract shall be two years beginning October 1, 2018 and ending on September 30, 2020. Either party has the right to terminate this contract at any time upon giving thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. At which time the contract shall become null and void.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made on September _____, 2018, between the City of Scottsbluff, Nebraska (the "City") and Rod Clause (the "Applicant").

Recitals:

- a. The City has adopted an Economic Development Plan pursuant to the Nebraska Local Option Municipal Economic Development Act (the "Plan"). Pursuant to the Plan, the City has implemented an Economic Development Program (the "Program").
- b. The Applicant has made application for assistance from the Program (the "Application").
- c. The Administrator of the Program (the "Administrator") and the City Economic Development Application Review Committee (the "Committee") have reviewed the Application and recommended to the City Council (the "Council") that a grant (the "Grant") be made to the Applicant from the City of Scottsbluff Economic Development Fund (the "Fund") as provided for in this Agreement. The City Council has approved the Committee's recommendation.
- d. The parties now desire to enter into this Agreement for the purpose of setting out the terms and conditions of the Grant.

Agreement:

1. Purpose of Assistance:

The Applicant operates a business known as "Der Töpfer Gallery and Studio" at 1211 3rd Avenue, Scottsbluff (the "Business"). The proceeds of the Grant shall be used to develop a website, for marketing and equipment purchases (the "Authorized Expenses").

2. Amount of Grant:

The Grant shall be in the maximum amount of \$10,000 and shall be disbursed from the Fund as provided for below.

3. Closing and Disbursement of Funds:

As soon as the Applicant has satisfied the conditions to Closing (as provided for below), the Closing shall be considered to have occurred. The Applicant may then request disbursements of the Grant (each, a "Disbursement") as follows:

a. The Applicant shall deliver to the City invoices or receipts for Authorized Expenses as they are incurred.

b. Upon approval of the documentation submitted, the amount of the approved Authorized Expenses shall be scheduled as a claim at the next Council meeting for which the claim may be reasonably scheduled. Disbursement of shall be made within 10 business days after the Council has approved a claim.

4. Conditions:

The Grant is being made based on the condition that the Applicant comply with the following:

- a. The Business shall remain open for 3 years from the Closing Date (the "Term").
- b. During the Term, by each April 15, the Applicant shall deliver a balance sheet and a copy of his federal income tax return to the City.

If the Business does not remain open or is sold during the Term, or the Applicant is not in compliance with the above condition, then the entire amount of the Grant shall be repaid (the "Repayment"). If the Repayment is not paid within 15 days after the Repayment is due, then the Repayment shall then carry interest at the rate of 7% per annum until paid.

5. Representations and Warranties of the Applicant:

The Applicant represents and warrants the following, all of which shall survive the Closing:

- a. The Applicant has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and carry out the transactions contemplated by this Agreement. This Agreement, and each agreement and instrument delivered by the Applicant pursuant to it, is the legal and binding obligation of the Applicant, enforceable against the Applicant in accordance with its terms.
- b. No representation or warranty made by the Applicant in this Agreement contains or will contain any untrue statement of any material fact, or omits or will fail to state any material fact known to the Applicant that are required to make the statements not misleading.
- c. The execution and performance of this Agreement will not violate any provision of law, or conflict with or result in any breach of any of the terms or conditions of, or constitute a default under any agreement or instrument to which the Applicant is a party or by which it is bound.
- d. The Applicants principal source of revenue is from the manufacturing or the sales of services in interstate commerce.

All representations and warranties made by the Applicant shall survive the Closing.

6. Representations and Warranties of the City:

The City represents and warrants the following, all of which shall survive the Closing:

- a. The City is a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of Nebraska, and has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and carry out the transactions contemplated by this Agreement. The City's execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement has been authorized by all necessary action on the part of the City. This Agreement, and each agreement and instrument delivered by the City pursuant to it, is the legal and binding obligation of the City, enforceable against the City in accordance with its terms.
- b. No representation or warranty made by the City in this Agreement contains or will contain any untrue statement of any material fact, or omits or will fail to state any material fact known to the City that is required to make the statements not misleading.

7. Certification of the Applicant:

The Applicant certifies to the City that it has not filed nor does it intend to file an application with the Department of Revenue to receive tax incentives under the Nebraska Advantage Act for the Business. In the event that the Application files such an application, it shall advise the City in writing, and the City shall have the option to review the status of the Grant, to include determining that the Repayment is due and payable if the Applicant is awarded incentives under the Nebraska Advantage Act.

8. Conditions to Closing:

Scottsbluff

The City's obligation to proceed with the Closing is subject to the Applicant's fulfillment of each of the following conditions at or prior to the Closing:

- a. All representations and warranties of the Applicant shall be true as of the Closing.
- b. In order to secure the Repayment, the Applicant shall have delivered to the City a Security Agreement covering the Applicant's equipment.
- c. The Applicant shall in all material respects have performed its obligations, agreements, and covenants contained in this Agreement to be performed by them, on, or before the Closing.
- d. There shall have been no material adverse change in the operation or financial status of the Applicant and the Closing shall constitute the Applicant's representations that there has been no such material adverse change.
- e. In requesting each Disbursement, the Applicant is considered to have represented that the above conditions have been satisfied and are continuing to be satisfied.

9. Default:

The Applicant shall be in default in this Agreement and the Note if any of the following happen:

- a. Failure to comply with any of the terms of this Agreement or the Security Agreement to include an assignment not permitted under this Agreement.
- b. Any warranty, representation or statement made or given to the City by the Applicant proves to have been false in any material respect when made or given.
- c. Dissolution or liquidation of any of the Applicant, the termination of existence, insolvency, business failure, appointment of a receiver, assignment for the benefit of creditors, or bankruptcy of the Applicant.
- d. The Applicant ceases to conduct the Business or moves the Business outside of the City.

10. Early Termination:

- a. The Applicant shall have the right at any time to terminate its participation in the Program by notifying the City in writing of its desire to do so.
- b. The City shall have the right to terminate the Applicant's participation in the Program if the Applicant is in default of any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, which default is not cured within 30 days of written notice by the City.
- c. In the event of a termination as described in this paragraph, the Repayment shall then be immediately due and payable to the Fund. Interest shall accrue at the rate of 7% per annum on any amounts not immediately paid.

11. Assignability:

The Administrator may assign his interest in this Agreement to any successor administrator designated by the City Council. The Applicant may not assign or transfer its interest in this Agreement without the consent of the Administrator.

12. Confidentiality:

It is agreed that this Agreement and its terms are public record and are not confidential. However, the City agrees to take reasonable steps to insure that any financial and proprietary information provided in connection with this Agreement by the Applicant shall remain confidential and shall not be revealed or disclosed to outside sources unless the information is public knowledge, is independently developed, or is required to be disclosed by law or legal process.

13. Notices:

Any notices or other communications between the parties shall be personally delivered, sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, by Federal Express or similar service that records delivery, to the addresses set out below, or to such other address as a party may designate, from time to time, by written notice to the other. A notice shall be deemed effective upon receipt.

a. If to the City:

b. If to the Applicant:

14. Miscellaneous:

- a. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with respect to its subject matter, and may only be modified by a writing signed by both of the parties.
- b. The City's waiver of any one default shall not be a waiver of the same or any other default in the future. In addition, the City's failure to exercise any right given to it by this Agreement shall not be a waiver of any later exercise of that right.
- c. The provisions of this Agreement are severable and if any provision is held to be invalid, the remainder of the Agreement shall remain in effect.
- d. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but which together shall constitute a single instrument.
 - e. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of Nebraska.
 - f. This Agreement shall be binding on the successors and assigns of the parties.

FIFTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

This Fifth Amendment to Agreement ("Fifth Amendment") is made September ____, 2018 between the City of Scottsbluff, Nebraska, a municipal corporation, ("Scottsbluff") and the City of Terrytown, Nebraska, a municipal corporation, ("Terrytown").

On December 9, 1987, Scottsbluff and Terrytown entered into an Agreement whereby Scottsbluff, as an independent contractor, agreed to provide Terrytown certain police services. Terrytown agreed Scottsbluff's law enforcement personnel would have authority to exercise law enforcement's activities within the jurisdiction of Terrytown. The Agreement has been amended over the course of time and is now being amended per this Fifth Amendment.

The original Agreement has continuing effect for additional twelve (12) month periods with the current 12-month period expiring on August 1, 2018. Scottsbluff and Terrytown agree to extend the original Agreement and all amendments until September 30, 2018, at which time the Agreement will continue for an additional 12-month period or until September 30, 2018. Scottsbluff and Terrytown also agree to continue with the Agreement in effect unless either party gives a six (6) month written notice to the other party of its intention to terminate the Agreement.

Scottsbluff and Terrytown desire to amend paragraph 3 of the Agreement, entitled "Consideration" which shall now be amended to read as follows:

3. Consideration.

In consideration for the services provided by Scottsbluff to Terrytown, and other promises or undertakings of Scottsbluff under this Agreement, Terrytown shall pay to Scottsbluff, effective October 1, 2018, the sum of \$130,000 during each twelve (12) month term. The payments shall be made in equal monthly installments of \$10,833.33 per month and shall be made on or before the 10th day of each month, commencing October 1, 2018.

The consideration shall be up for review every five (5) years following October 1, 2018 and shall be adjusted on every fifth anniversary by an increase in the Consumer Price Index ("CPI") since the date of this Fifth Addendum. For purposes of this paragraph, the CPI shall mean the Consumer Price Index of the Minneapolis Federal Reserve Bank ("Index") or the successor of that Index. If the Index substantially changes the method of calculation of the CPI, an adjustment shall be made in the revised CPI which would produce results equivalent, as nearly as possible, to those which would be obtained if the CPI had not been so revised. If the CPI shall be discontinued or becomes unavailable to the public because its publication is

discontinued, or if the CPI for any other reason ceases to be a valid measure of the purchasing power of the consumer dollar, then Scottsbluff shall substitute a comparable index based upon changes in the cost of living or consumer purchasing power of the dollar published by any other Federal Reserve Bank or governmental agency, or if no such index is available, then a comparable index published by a major bank, other financial institution, university or recognized financial publication may be agreed upon.
