The Scottsbluff City Council met in a regular meeting on February 19, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 2525 Circle Drive, Scottsbluff. Since the regular meeting date would fall on a City recognized holiday the meeting was moved to the following day according to §6-1-12. A notice of the meeting had been published on February 15, 2019, in the Star Herald, a newspaper published and of general circulation in the City. The notice stated the date, hour and place of the meeting, that the meeting would be open to the public, that anyone with a disability desiring reasonable accommodations to attend the Council meeting should contact the City Clerk's Office, and that an agenda of the meeting kept continuously current was available for public inspection at the office of the City Clerk in City Hall; provided, the City Council could modify the agenda at the meeting if it determined that an emergency so required. A similar notice, together with a copy of the agenda, also had been emailed to each council member, made available to radio stations KNEB, KMOR, KOAQ, and television stations KSTF and NBC Nebraska, and the Star Herald. The notice was also available on the city's website on February 15, 2019.

Mayor Gonzales presided and City Clerk Wright recorded the proceedings. The meeting was called to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Mayor Gonzales welcomed everyone in attendance and encouraged all citizens to participate in the council meeting asking those wishing to speak to come to the microphone and state their name and who they are representing for the record. Mayor Gonzales informed those in attendance that a copy of the Nebraska open meetings act is posted in the back of the room on the west wall for the public's review. The following Council Members were present: Raymond Gonzales, Scott Shaver, Jeanne McKerrigan, Nathan Green and Terry Schaub. Also present were City Manager Johnson and Deputy City Attorney John L. Selzer. Absent: None.

Mayor Gonzales asked if there were any changes to the agenda. Ms. Jada Thompson with Contryman and Associates presented the report from the 2018 Audit. She complimented Finance Director Hilyard for preparing an excellent set of financial statements and the work that Ms. Hilyard and City Manager Johnson have done to assure that the day to day progress is smooth. She reported that there are no issues that were notable; they issued an unmodified opinion, which is the best report possible. Ms. Thompson thanked the City council for the opportunity to conduct the City of Scottsbluff audit. Moved by Council Member Schaub, seconded by Council Member McKerrigan, "to accept the 2018 City of Scottsbluff Audit," "YEAS," Schaub, McKerrigan, Gonzales, Green, and Shaver. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Mr. Johnson presented the report on General Fund revenue for the current fiscal year. He explained the sales tax report is in two month arrears and shows for the reporting month of February a year to date decline of approximately \$86,000. The lodging tax also shows a year to date decline of approximately \$11,000 and because of the decreases he suggests forwarding to the revenue committee to look at revenue projections for the current fiscal year, as well as the upcoming budget year.

Police Chief Spencer was present to answer questions regarding the tow contract for the Police Department. Council Member Shaver asked if this was standard or if there have been any changes from past contracts, with Mr. Spencer answering it is virtually the same; it is a competitive process to keep prices down. Council Member Green made the motion, seconded by Council Member Shaver "to approve the bid specifications for the Police Tow Service three year contract and authorize the city clerk to advertise for bids to be received by March 11, 2019 at 11:00 a.m.," "YEAS," Gonzales, Green, McKerrigan, Shaver, and Schaub. "NAYS," None. Absent: None.

Regarding the bid specifications for the purchase of a Wide Area Mower, Mr. Johnson informed Council the funding source would be the Capital Projects Fund and this request is in the current CIP budget to replace an outdated mower we have had several issues with. Council Member Shaver questioned if we could use mowers that run on the tractor, saving money by using the same tractor for everything; Mr. Johnson responded this mower has 126 inch deck. Council Member McKerrigan made the motion, seconded by Council Member Schaub “to approve the bid specifications for the purchase of a Wide Area Rotary Mower and authorize the city clerk to advertise for bids to be received by March 15, 2019 at 2:00 p.m.,” “YEAS,” McKerrigan, Shaver, Green, Schaub, and Gonzales. “NAYS,” None. Absent: None.

Mayor Gonzales opened the public hearing at 6:25 p.m. to submit question of whether property generally described as land bounded by US Highway 26 on the northeast, East Overland Drive on the south, and 21st Avenue on the west is blighted and substandard. Ms. Susan Myers with M.C. Schaff and Associates came forward and explained to Council this particular study area would have been included with the original East Overland blight study area had it been in city limits at the time. The obvious reason for it to be included now is low elevation compared to the surrounding area and drainage constraints. She noted the study was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Selzer and he concurred it is defensible, meeting the state statutes of the definition of blight. Also, this project is less than 38 acres which will bring the City’s blight percentage to 25.4% which is under the limit of 35%. Legal Counsel Selzer commented the statutory notices for this public hearing were given, which is required by state law and the blight study was reviewed and recommended by the Planning Commission. There were no comments from the public. Mayor Gonzales closed the public hearing at 6:29 p.m.

Council Member Shaver expressed concern the property does not meet the definition of blighted and substandard due to part of it being ag land recently annexed into the City. Legal Counsel Selzer explained that the blighted and substandard determination must be made without regard to any potential projects in the area. He explained the fact that this area is adjacent to the previous blighted and substandard area is significant and that the City Council has discretion to declare this area blighted and substandard and can find the property is necessary to make a comprehensive redevelopment area with the previous blight and substandard area.

Council Member McKerrigan made the motion, seconded by Council Member Schaub, “to adopt Resolution 19-02-02 declaring that property generally described as land bounded by US Highway 26 on the northeast, East Overland Drive on the south, and 21st Avenue on the west is blighted and substandard as those terms are defined in the Community Redevelopment Law,” “YEAS,” Gonzales, Schaub, and McKerrigan. “NAYS,” Green and Shaver. Absent: None

RESOLUTION 19-02-02

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSBLUFF, NEBRASKA:

Recitals:

a. The City Council of the City of Scottsbluff has considered the question of whether the area described below is “substandard and blighted,” as those terms are defined in the Community Development Law, NEB. REV. STAT. § 18-2101 *et seq.*, and in need of redevelopment.

b. The area being considered is generally described as land bounded by US Highway 26 on the northeast, East Overland Drive on the south and 21st Avenue on the west and more particularly described as: Land Situated in the Southwest Quarter of Section 19, Township 22 North, Range 54 West of the 6th P.M., Scotts Bluff County, Nebraska, more particularly described as follows: Beginning at the Southwest Corner of Section 19, thence northerly on the west line of the Southwest Quarter of Section 19 on an assumed bearing of N02°11'37"E, a distance of 1579.26 feet, thence bearing S87°48'23"E, a distance of 33.00 feet to the point of intersection with the east 33 foot right of way line of 21st Avenue, thence southerly on said right of way line, bearing S02°11'37"W, a distance of 129.34 feet, to the point of intersection with the east line of a tract of land reserved for additional highway right of way as described in Deed Book 209, Page 114, thence northeasterly on said east line, bearing N08°33'45"E, a distance of 386.38 feet measured (386.30 feet record), to the point of intersection with the south right of way line of U.S. Highway 26, as described in Deed Book 108, Page 328, and the point of intersection with a non-tangent curve to the right, said curve having a central angle of 25°43'59"E, radius of 4317.37 feet, a chord bearing of S38°32'58"E and a chord length of 1922.79 feet, thence southeasterly on the arc of said curve and said right of way line, a distance of 1939.04 feet, to the point of intersection with the east line of the west half of the Southwest Quarter Section 19, and a point being 373.50 feet (Record and Measured) north of the sixteenth section corner as described in Deed Book 108, Page 328, thence southerly on said sixteenth section line, bearing S01°57'46"W, a distance of 1.90 feet, to the point of intersection with a tract of land as described in Deed Book 192, Page 85, said line also being the south right of way line of U.S. Highway 26, thence southeasterly on the north line of said tract and said south right of way line, bearing S22°55'32"E, a distance of 164.92 feet, thence southwesterly on the east line of said tract and U.S. Highway 26 right of way, bearing S13°18'40"W, a distance of 154.27 feet, (record and measured), to the point of intersection with the north line of highway right of way as described in Deed Book 108, Page 328, thence bearing S89°36'29"W, a distance of 39.08 feet, to the point of intersection with the east line of the west half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 19, thence southerly on said sixteenth section line, bearing S01°57'46"W, a distance of 4.13 feet, and the point of intersection with the north right of way line of U.S. Highway 26 Right of Way as described in Deed Book 108, Page 328, thence northwesterly on said right of way line, bearing N89°14'02"W, a distance of 225.37 feet measured (225.6 feet record), thence southerly on said right of way line, bearing S02°02'14"W, a distance of 60.00 feet record and measured, to the point of intersection with the south line of the Southwest Quarter of Section 19, thence westerly on said section line, bearing N87°57'46"W, a distance of 1106.91 feet, to the Point of Beginning, said tract containing an area of 37.79 Acres, more or less (the “Redevelopment Area”).

c. The City Council has caused to be conducted a substandard and blighted study relating to the Redevelopment Area from M.C. Schaff & Associates, Inc. (the “Study”).

d. The City Council has submitted the question of whether the Redevelopment Area is substandard and blighted to the Planning Commission.

e. The Planning Commission received the Study and conducted a public hearing on February 11, 2019 for the purpose of making a recommendation to the City Council as to whether the Redevelopment Area is and should be determined as substandard and blighted and in need of redevelopment. The Planning Commission provided its written recommendation to the City Council that the Redevelopment Area should be declared substandard and blighted and in need of redevelopment.

f. The City Council conducted a public hearing on February 19, 2019 on the question of whether the Redevelopment Area is substandard and blighted and in need of redevelopment.

g. The City Council has determined that declaring the Redevelopment Area as substandard and blighted is necessary to accomplish the sound redevelopment planning and program of the City, will enhance the development potential of the Redevelopment Area as well as adjacent areas already declared substandard and blighted, and will create a continuous, harmonious redevelopment area from the current blighted and substandard areas to U.S. Highway 26.

Resolved:

1. Based on the above recitals, the Planning Commission's recommendation, the Study and its findings which are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference, and the comments at the public hearing, the City Council declares that the Redevelopment Area as substandard and blighted, as those terms are defined in the Community Development Law, and in need of redevelopment.

2. All prior resolutions of the City Council in conflict with the terms and provisions of this Resolution are repealed to the extent of such conflicts.

3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

Regarding the Ordinance to amend high school parking maps of parking lots to enforce traffic regulations, Police Chief Spencer informed Council they are replacing the old map with a new one due to the high school remodel. Council Member Shaver asked why we do parking regulations at the school; Mr. Spencer stated the school security guards address the issues and the City gets involved only if called by the school.

Council Member Green introduced Ordinance No. 4243 to amend high school maps of parking lots to enforce traffic regulations which was read by title on first reading: **AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSBLUFF, NEBRASKA, AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE TO REVISE §22-2-99, PROVIDING A NEW DRAWING OF THE PREMISES OF SCOTTSBLUFF SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL FOLLOWING RENOVATION, FOR ENFORCEMENT OF PARKING AND REGULATION OF AUTOMOBILES ON THE PREMISES OF SCOTTSBLUFF SENIOR HIGH,**

PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM: Moved by Council Member Schaub, seconded by Council Member McKerrigan “that the statutory rule requiring the Ordinance be read by title on three different days be suspended,” “YEAS,” Gonzales, Green, McKerrigan, and Schaub. “NAYS,” Shaver. Absent: None.

The motion carried having been approved by three-fourths of the Council Members. Moved by Council Member McKerrigan, seconded by Council Member Schaub, “that Ordinance No. 4243 be adopted,” “YEAS,” McKerrigan, Shaver, Green, Schaub, and Gonzales. “NAYS,” None. Absent: None.

Mr. Johnson informed Council we changed the terms of the sewer cleaning service proposed renewal agreements to only deal with emergency cleaning services at the request of the contractee. The changes include a charge of \$350.00 per hour for emergency cleaning services, plus labor, and this change allows for employees and equipment to return to perform their intended work in Scottsbluff. The entities affected by this agreement include: the Cities of Bayard and Terrytown, Villages of Melbeta and Morrill, Sanitary Improvement Districts 4A and 8 (includes hydrant maintenance) and Western Nebraska Community College and Western Nebraska Veterans Home. Council Member Schaub made the motion, seconded by Council Member McKerrigan, “to approve the emergency Sewer Cleaning and Fire Hydrant Maintenance Agreements for three year terms and authorize the Mayor to sign the Agreements,” “YEAS,” Shaver, Gonzales, Schaub, McKerrigan, and Green. “NAYS,” None. Absent: None.

Regarding the Agreement for the Umpire Coordinator and Concession Stand Operator, Mr. Johnson explained this contract is for the 2019 softball season and will save the City approximately \$350.00 per year due to combining the two. Last year the net revenue to the City was \$4,584.00 and Mr. Bernhardt will be paid \$4500.00 in five equal monthly installments as there is no change to the contract from last year. Council Member Shaver made the motion, seconded by Council Member Schaub, “to approve the agreement with Kirk Bernhardt as the Umpire Coordinator and Concession Stand Operator at Lacy Park for the 2019 softball season and authorize the Mayor to sign the Agreement,” “YEAS,” Schaub, McKerrigan, Gonzales, Green, and Shaver. “NAYS,” None. Absent: None.

Ms. Terry Rajewich, Retail Account Manager with Nebraska Public Power District approached Council and gave a presentation on the Community Solar Project II. She explained the size of the project is 4.6 megawatts and is available only to residents and businesses within the city limits of Scottsbluff, excluding street lights or any customer who currently has their own generation. She added one solar energy share is equal to 150 kilowatt hour/month of solar energy and the customer’s maximum is computed by their one year annual average consumption, showing as a credit or charge line item on their bill. Customers are charged a \$50.00 enrollment fee, refundable on their three year anniversary date, and can exit the program at any time after one month with the City absorbing the cost of the share. She reminded Council that Scottsbluff already has a 128 kilowatt solar area in front of NPPD, which is the first community solar project, and those customers are getting a charge on their bill because the project is greater than what it costs to produce the energy and provide it to them. However, because of the new rate at 5.19 cents per kilowatt hour and the size of the new project area, the cost for all subscribers will be blended at 5.239 cents per kilowatt hour, which is less than the base energy credit at 5.8 cents per kilowatt hour. Mr. Johnson added all City accounts will be on the solar project as Scottsbluff has one of the lowest Professional Power Agreement (PPA) rates right now across the state. He also noted the site will

be at the Landers Soccer Complex with the solar panels being fenced off, adding the façade will be aesthetically pleasing with pollinator plants included for beauty and educational experience.

The Community Solar Project Agreement was introduced by Mr. Johnson, letting Council know that the City will fully subscribe the solar array not being used by residential or commercial customers; the contract is for 25 years and staff recommends approving the agreement. Council Member McKerrigan made the motion, seconded by Council Member Schaub, “to approve the Community Solar Project Agreement for Scottsbluff Solar II and authorize the Mayor to sign the Agreement,” “YEAS,” Gonzales, Green, McKerrigan, Shaver, and Schaub. “NAYS,” None. Absent: None.

Regarding the agreement with Bid It Bob Auction Service to conduct public auctions of unclaimed and abandoned property in possession of the City, Mr. Johnson explained to Council we did not go out for bids for unclaimed and abandoned property because there is only one auction business in city limits that has an online data base and showroom. Police Chief Spencer added we need to get rid of surplus property and by doing it the way we are now is inconvenient because the company we consign with cannot get to us in a timely fashion and all items need to be tagged and inventoried; by keeping the service in city limits, these small items can be disposed of faster through weekly and live auctions. Council Members Green and Shaver were concerned with the pricing and commission received by the auction service. Chief Spencer acknowledged their concern, but stated it would speed up the process for employees, essentially costing less, and also make space in the evidence room. Council Member Schaub made the motion, seconded by Council Member McKerrigan, “to approve the agreement with Bid It Bob Auction Service to conduct public auction of unclaimed and abandoned property in possession of the City and authorize the Mayor to execute the Agreement,” “YEAS,” McKerrigan, Shaver, Green, Schaub, and Gonzales. “NAYS,” None. Absent: None.

Regarding dismissing the bids for sanitation services, Mr. Johnson reminded Council they agreed at the last meeting to extend the Phase One contract with TriHydro to site a new landfill. Because of this extension, he recommends the bids be dismissed from TDS and Waste Connections as it appears we want to build a new landfill with the City of Gering. Council Member Shaver disagreed stating we are in a contract to look at landfill sites; he would like to talk to Gering to see if they would be interested in us going with one of the bids to extend their life in their landfill. He also commented maybe letting them use our tree dump to get some of our money back out of it. Council Member Green stated he had serious reservations about voting on the extension at the last meeting, feeling the City would lose the \$400,000. He stressed he does not feel comfortable with dismissing the bids and “moved to not dismiss the bids,” Council Member Shaver seconded the motion. “YEAS,” Green, Schaub, and Shaver. “NAYS,” Gonzales and McKerrigan. Mayor Gonzales stated the bids will remain as submitted, but acknowledged the bids may expire and would be dismissed anyway and because of this, Mr. Johnson was asked by Council to reach out and get validity of the bids. Council Member Shaver asked that we talk to Gering to see how they feel with letting us out of the contract to extend their life in their landfill. Council Member McKerrigan voiced agreement on wanting to meet with Gering to get information.

Due to Council not wanting to dismiss the bids for sanitation services, Mr. Johnson recommended tabling the bid specifications for the refuse truck. Council Member Shaver made the motion, seconded by Mayor Gonzales, “to table the bid specifications for the refuse truck,” “YEAS,” Shaver, Gonzales, Schaub, McKerrigan, and Green. “NAYS,” None. Absent: None.

Under public comments, Council Member Green stated concern for traffic on 27th street. He mentioned there is a bus stop sign in front of the flashing lights and this may be hampering to drivers; feeling the crosswalk is not safe.

Under Council Reports, Council Member Shaver stated 911 met on February 19th and he felt they received a good contract for the cars to access the information; no specifics on the tower. PAWS meeting for the Nebraska region was set up; supposed to have a joint meeting with Wyoming that was cancelled due to lack of participants. Council Member McKerrigan met with the Tri City Active Living Advisory Council and they are preparing for the Tour De Nebraska bike tournament this summer. She also met with the Senior Center stating concerns they have regarding upcoming funding; mentioning they were grateful for the boiler leak getting fixed. Mayor Gonzales gave to each council member a PADD update. He and Council Member McKerrigan went to the Regional Governance meeting at the high school asking each council member to participate in future meetings. Council Member Green went to a Board of Directors meeting at the Zoo, giving an update and mentioning a change in title only for Anthony Mason to Executive Director. Council Member Schaub went to the East Overland Steering Committee.

Council Member Shaver made the motion, seconded by Council Member Schaub, “to adjourn the meeting at 7:55 p.m.,” “YEAS,” Shaver, Gonzales, Schaub, McKerrigan, and Green. “NAYS,” None. Absent: None.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION REVIEW COMMITTEE
February 15, 2019

The meeting of the Economic Development Application Review Committee was held on February 15, 2019 at 8:00 a.m. at City Hall, 2525 Circle Drive, Scottsbluff, Nebraska.

Present were committee members Jim Trumbull, Hod Kosman, Dave Schaff, Marla Marx, and Nate Merrigan. Also in attendance on behalf of the City was Starr Lehl, City Economic Director, Liz Hilyard, City Finance Director, and Adam Hoelsing, Deputy City Attorney.

Chairman Trumbull called the meeting to order at 8:01 a.m. and stated that a copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was located on the south wall of the Council Chamber. There were no changes to the agenda.

It was moved by member Marx, and seconded by member Kosman that the minutes of the January 11, 2019 committee meeting be approved. Voting yes: Trumbull, Schaff, Marx, Merrigan and Kosman. Voting no: None.

First item on the agenda was an approval of a waiver request from Croell, Inc. An economic development package was offered to Croell, Inc. following the January 11, 2019 Committee meeting. City Staff and Croell, Inc. were able to agree to the terms of the assistance package, which involved a loan/grant of \$750,000 repayable generally over 10 years. As part of the assistance package, however, City Staff requested a blanket security agreement on personal property assets of Croell, Inc., and a guarantee of the assistance agreement from Kurt Croell, William Croell, and Joseph Croell (the majority shareholders of Croell, Inc.). Croell, Inc. declined the blanket security agreement and guarantee and requested the Committee waive those requirements as part of the economic development assistance agreement.

Generally, a blanket security agreement and a guarantee of shareholders or owners is a requirement of all applicants of the City's economic development program. Croell, Inc., however, was unable to provide a blanket security agreement due to the policies of its primary lender, Associated Bank. Associated Bank does not allow a blanket security agreement to act as a second lien on the personal property assets of Croell, Inc. Croell, Inc. also declined to provide the guarantee due to its corporate policies of avoiding personal guarantees where possible. Croell, Inc. did offer the City a first priority lien on the real estate for which the economic development assistance is being provided. Croell, Inc. estimated the real estate to be worth approximately \$2.8 million in acquisition and development value, and therefore felt that a first priority lien on the real estate was sufficient collateral for the assistance package.

The Committee felt that a first lien priority on the real estate was sufficient collateral for the assistance agreement with Croell, Inc. Additionally, the Committee noted that Croell, Inc. is a stronger applicant (at least financially) than is typically seen by the Committee. Croell, Inc. is an ongoing operating business with a strong financial picture and a regional scope. The

Committee felt this application was different, at least from a financial strength perspective, than other start-up or fledgling businesses that may apply to the City's economic development program. For these reasons, it was moved by member Kosman, and seconded by member Merrigan to waive the blanket security agreement and guarantee requirements of the City's economic development assistance agreement with Croell, Inc. Voting yes: Trumbull, Schaff, Merrigan, Marx, and Kosman. Voting no: None.

Discussion was then had among the Committee members and City Staff as to modifying the economic development program application to clarify general collateral requirements of the City before the application is submitted. At the very least, this change would allow the applicant to understand the collateral requirements before the first meeting with the Committee and to be prepared to request any waiver or differentiation in those requirements during its first meeting with the Committee. The Committee also suggested strengthening portions of the standard economic development assistance agreement to clarify the definition of "default" when a business may change sites in the community or otherwise operate remotely.

City Economic Development Director Starr Lehl provided an update on Prime Metals Inc. Prime Metals is a previous applicant of the economic development program, and assistance from the program has been approved from the Committee, but not closed by the City due to a delay on Prime Metals' part. Starr Lehl was able to provide that Prime Metals still intends to develop an area in Gering, Nebraska for manufacturing, but is waiting on financing from a new investor.

City Finance Director Liz Hilyard provided an update as to the size of the economic development fund, and member Schaff provided an update as to possible expansion and development of an area near the West Nebraska Regional Airport for a new or improved Fed Ex facility.

The final item for discussion by the Committee was the possible new committee chair. Chairman Trumbull provided his history and background with the Committee, having served on the Committee since its inception. Chairman Trumbull felt that it may be time or getting near the time for a new chairman to serve on the Committee, and discussed several members of the Committee that may be willing or available to do so. Other Committee members replied as to their willingness or concerns as serving as Chairman, and the Committee decided to delay discussion for a new Chairman until a later date.

The meeting was then adjourned at 8:28 a.m.

Development Program: This project will enhance the basic economy of Scottsbluff and represents a good leverage of EDP funding. Croell, Inc. is expanding its local presence in the community to provide corporate support as well as supply ready mix concrete, mine and produce aggregate products, provide equipment repair and service support for the Scottsbluff region of its multi-state business operations. Job creation is projected to be minimum of 11 new positions over the existing 6 positions. While the number of high-quality local jobs to be created is not huge, the wage levels, benefits and stability of the company will have a significant positive impact on the local economy. The wage rates for job creation are competitive and therefore represent a solid contribution to local wealth.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made on March 4, 2019, between the City of Scottsbluff, Nebraska (the “City”) and Croell, Inc. (the “Applicant”).

Recitals:

a. The City has adopted an Economic Development Plan pursuant to the Nebraska Local Option Municipal Economic Development Act (the “Plan”). Pursuant to the Plan, the City has implemented an Economic Development Program (the “Program”).

b. The Applicant has made application for assistance from the Program (the “Application”);

c. The Administrator of the Program (the “Administrator”) and the City Economic Development Application Review Committee (the “Committee”) have reviewed the Application and recommended to the City Council (the “Council”) that a loan (the “Loan”) be made to the Applicant from the City of Scottsbluff Economic Development Fund (the “Fund”) as provided for in this Agreement. The City Council has approved the Committee’s recommendation.

d. The parties now desire to enter into this Agreement for the purpose of setting out the terms and conditions of the Loan.

Agreement:

1. Purpose of Loan:

The Applicant is an Iowa corporation doing business in a multi-state area. The Applicant is in the business of manufacturing and selling ready mix concrete, and in manufacturing and selling concrete and asphalt for roadway paving. The Applicant owns real estate at or near 120549 CR 26, Scottsbluff, Nebraska 69361, and is in the process of developing that real estate for regional headquarters for its operations in Western Nebraska (the “Business”). The proceeds of the Loan will be used primarily for the development and operation of the real estate as a batch plant and regional headquarters for the Business.

2. Amount of Loan:

The Loan shall be in the amount of \$750,000 and shall be disbursed from the City’s Economic Development Fund (the “Fund”) to the Applicant as provided for below. The Loan shall be represented by a promissory note (the “Note”) to be signed at the Loan Closing in the form of the attached Note. The Note shall carry interest from July 1, 2019 (the “Note Interest Date”) at the Annual Applicable Federal Mid Term rate for the month of the Loan Closing. Repayment shall be as set out below.

3. Loan Disbursement and Loan Closing:

As soon as the Applicant has satisfied the conditions to the Loan Closing, the amount of the Loan shall be scheduled as a claim at the next Council meeting for which the matter may be reasonably scheduled. Disbursement of the Loan proceeds shall be made within 10 business after the Council has approved a claim for the Loan. The disbursement of the Loan proceeds shall constitute the “Loan Closing”.

4. Job Credits:

a. As long as the Applicant is not in default of the Note, this Agreement, or any other document entered into pursuant to this Agreement, the Applicant shall be eligible for credit against the balance due under the Note for Job Credits earned during a Year. A “Year” shall mean the 12-month period ending on each June 30, with the first Year beginning July 1, 2019. “Annual Job Credits” shall be calculated as follows:

(1) The Applicant is eligible to receive a “Base Annual Job Credit” during a Year equal to the FTE’s for a Year multiplied by \$3,000.

(2) If at the end of a Year, (1) the Annual Report (as provided for below) indicates that the Applicant has any FTE’s that have average earnings for the Year of at least (i) \$14 per hour in the case of hourly employees, or (ii) \$29,120 in the case of salaried employees, and (2) such employees are eligible for the Applicant’s fringe benefit plan, then the Applicant may earn additional job credits (the “Additional Annual Credits”) as calculated on a per employee basis based on the following table:

(3) In calculating the hourly rate or salary rate for purposes of the above table, the Applicant is entitled to add the hourly equivalent or annual cost of the following fringe benefits provided to the applicable employee by the Applicant: Applicant’s 401k Plan contribution, pension or equivalent retirement benefits, health, dental, or vision insurance, disability insurance, and any bonuses or profit-sharing payments.

b. For purposes of this Agreement, Annual Job Credit shall mean the total of all Base Annual Job Credits and the Additional Annual Credits.

c. For each Year of the Loan, the amount of the Annual Job Credit may not exceed \$43,000 per Year (the “Maximum Annual Credit”). If the Applicant earns credits in excess of the Maximum Annual Credit in any one Year, the excess credits may be carried back to one or more prior Years where the Maximum Annual Credit was not earned, as long as the Maximum Annual Credit is not exceeded for any one Year. Excess credits may not be carried forward.

5. Asphalt Job Credits:

a. As long as the Applicant is not in default of the Note, this Agreement, or any other document entered into pursuant to this Agreement, the Applicant shall be eligible for credit against the “Balloon Payment” (as defined below) due under the Note for Asphalt Plant Job Credits earned during a Year. A “Year” shall mean the 12-month period ending on each June 30, with the first Year beginning July 1, 2019. “Annual Asphalt Plant Job Credits” shall be calculated as follows:

(1) The Applicant is eligible to receive an “Annual Asphalt Plant Job Credit” during a Year equal to the Asphalt FTE’s (as defined below) for a Year multiplied by \$3,000. The “Annual Asphalt Plant Job Credit” shall mean the total of all Asphalt FTE’s multiplied by \$3,000

(2) At the end of a Year, to earn an Asphalt FTE, then the following must occur: (1) the Annual Report (as provided for below) must indicate that the Asphalt FTE has an average earnings for the Year of at least (i) \$19.00 per hour in the case of hourly employees, or (ii) \$40,000 in the case of salaried employees, and (2) such employees must be eligible for the Applicant’s fringe benefit plan.

(3) In calculating the hourly rate or salary rate for purposes of the above table, the Applicant is entitled to add the hourly equivalent or annual cost of the following fringe benefits provided to the applicable employee by the Applicant: Applicant’s 401k Plan contribution, pension or equivalent retirement benefits, health, dental, or vision insurance, disability insurance, and any bonuses or profit-sharing payments.

b. For each Year of the Loan, the amount of the Annual Asphalt Plant Job Credit may not exceed \$15,000 per Year (the “Maximum Annual Asphalt Plant Credit”). If the Applicant earns credits in excess of the Maximum Annual Asphalt Plant Credit in any one Year, the excess credits may be carried back to one or more prior Years where the Maximum Annual Asphalt Plant Credit was not earned, as long as the Maximum Annual Asphalt Plant Credit is not exceeded for any one Year. Excess credits may not be carried forward.

6. Note Repayment:

The Note shall be repayable as follows:

a. The principal of the Loan shall begin to accrue interest on the Note Interest Date at the Annual Applicable Federal Mid Term rate for the month of the Loan Closing, and shall be payable in 10 equal annual installments (the “Annual Installments”) and one \$75,000 balloon payment (the “Balloon Payment”) due on October 1, 2029. The first Annual Installment shall be due and payable on July 1, 2020, and each Annual Installment shall be due and payable on each July 1 thereafter.

b. Upon receipt of an Annual Report, the City will make a preliminary review based on the Annual Job Credits claimed. The amount of the Annual Job Credits, adjusted for any adjustments from the preliminary review, shall then be applied against the Annual Installment due at the end of the Year of the Annual Report. Once the Annual Job Credit is applied, the City shall then notify the Applicant of the remaining amount of the Annual Installment due, and the remaining amount shall be paid by the Applicant on or before the October 1 following the Year of the Annual Report.

c. Additionally, upon receipt of an Annual Report, the City will make a preliminary review based on the Annual Asphalt Plant Job Credits claimed. The amount of the Annual Asphalt Plant Job Credits, adjusted for any adjustments from the preliminary review, shall then be applied against the Balloon Payment amount after each Year for which an Annual Report is filed. Once all Annual Asphalt Plant Job Credits are applied, the City shall then notify the Applicant of the remaining amount of the Balloon Payment due, if any, and the remaining amount shall be paid by the Applicant on or before October 1, 2029.

7. Employee Definitions:

a. Determining “FTE’s” shall be as follows:

(1) “Full Time Employee” shall mean a bona fide employee of the Applicant who (1) is classified by the Applicant as full time; and (2) subject to normal and reasonable waiting periods, is eligible for the employer’s normal fringe benefit package. The normal fringe benefit package must, at the least, include a health insurance plan which provides for employee coverage with a significant contribution made by the Applicant.

(2) “Eligible Full Time Employee” shall mean a Full Time Employee who: (1) works in Scotts Bluff County, Nebraska, and (2) resides within 60 miles of the corporate limits of the City; provided, however any Full Time Employee who does not reside within 60 miles of the corporate limits of the City at the time that the Full Time Employee is hired, shall nevertheless be considered an Eligible Full Time Employee if the Full Time Employee moves to a residence within the required geographic area within 6 months of the hiring of the Eligible Full Time Employee.

(3) “Full Time Equivalent” Employees (the “FTE’s”) shall be the number arrived at by dividing the total hours paid by the Applicant to their Eligible Full Time

Employees during a Year, divided by 2,080 hours, rounded down to the nearest tenth, and then subtracting 6 FTE's per Year for the full-time employees of the Applicant already existing at the time of the Application. Salaried employees shall be presumed to have been paid on the basis of 2,080 hours per Year.

b. Determining "Asphalt FTE's" shall be as follows:

(1) "Full Time Asphalt Plant Employee" shall mean a bona fide employee of the Applicant who (1) works primarily at and for the purpose of an asphalt plant constructed by the Applicant at the site of the Business (2) is classified by the Applicant as full time; and (3) subject to normal and reasonable waiting periods, is eligible for the employer's normal fringe benefit package. The normal fringe benefit package must, at the least, include a health insurance plan which provides for employee coverage with a significant contribution made by the Applicant.

(2) "Eligible Full Time Employee" shall mean a Full Time Asphalt Plant Employee who: (1) works in Scotts Bluff County, Nebraska, and (2) resides within 60 miles of the corporate limits of the City; provided, however any Full Time Employee who does not reside within 60 miles of the corporate limits of the City at the time that the Full Time Employee is hired, shall nevertheless be considered an Eligible Full Asphalt Plant Time Employee if the Full Time Asphalt Plant Employee moves to a residence within the required geographic area within 6 months of the hiring of the Eligible Full Time Asphalt Plant Employee.

(3) "Asphalt Plant Full Time Equivalent" Employees (the "Asphalt FTE's") shall be the number arrived at by dividing the total hours paid by the Applicant to their Eligible Full Time Asphalt Plant Employees during a Year, divided by 2,080 hours, and then rounded down to the nearest tenth. Salaried employees shall be presumed to have been paid on the basis of 2,080 hours per Year.

8 Representations and Warranties of the Applicant:

The Applicant represents and warrants the following, all of which shall survive the Closing:

a. The Applicant is a corporation organized, existing, and in good standing under the laws of Iowa. The Applicant is registered in Nebraska as a foreign corporation, and is authorized to transact business in Nebraska. The Applicant has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and carry out the transactions contemplated by this Agreement. The Applicant's execution, delivery, and performance of this Agreement have been authorized by all necessary action on the part of the Applicant. This Agreement, and each agreement and instrument delivered by the Applicant pursuant to it, is the legal and binding obligation of the Applicant, enforceable against the Applicant in accordance with its terms.

b. No representation or warranty made by the Applicant in this Agreement contains or will contain any untrue statement of any material fact, or omits or will fail to state any material fact known to the Applicant that are required to make the statements not misleading.

c. The execution and performance of this Agreement will not violate any provision of law, or conflict with or result in any breach of any of the terms or conditions of, or constitute a default under any indenture, mortgage, agreement or other instrument to which the Applicant is a party or by which they are bound.

d. All representations and warranties made by the Applicant shall survive the Loan Closing.

9. Representations and Warranties of the City:

The City represents and warrants the following, all of which shall survive the Loan Closing:

a. The City is a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of Nebraska, and has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and carry out the transactions contemplated by this Agreement. The City's execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement has been authorized by all necessary action on the part of the City. This Agreement, and each agreement and instrument delivered by the City pursuant to it, is the legal and binding obligation of the City, enforceable against the City in accordance with its terms.

b. No representation or warranty made by the City in this Agreement contains or will contain any untrue statement of any material fact, or omits or will fail to state any material fact known to the City that is required to make the statements not misleading.

10. Conditions to Loan Closing:

The City's obligation to proceed with the Loan Closing is subject to the Applicant's fulfillment of each of the following conditions at or prior to the Loan Closing:

a. All representations and warranties of the Applicant shall be true as of the Loan Closing.

b. The Applicant shall have delivered to the City:

(1) Evidence of Good Standing of the Applicant from the Iowa Secretary of State and the Nebraska Secretary of State.

(2) A copy of the current and correct Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Applicant certified by the Secretary of the Applicant to be correct;

(3) Certified resolutions of the Applicants Board of Directors authorizing this Agreement and providing for signature authority.

c. The Applicant shall have received a loan from Associated Bank as provided for in the Application.

d. In order to secure the Loan and the repayment, the Applicant shall have delivered to the City a deed of trust (the "Deed of Trust") covering the Applicant's real estate at the Business. The form of the Deed of Trust is attached.

e. The Applicant shall in all material respects have performed its obligations, agreements, and covenants contained in this Agreement to be performed by them, on, or before the Loan Closing.

f. There shall have been no material adverse change in the operation or financial status of the Applicant and the Loan Closing shall constitute the Applicant's representations that there has been no such material adverse change.

g. In requesting the disbursement of the Loan, the Applicant is considered to have represented that the above conditions have been satisfied and are continuing to be satisfied.

11. Annual Reports:

If the Applicant desires to claim Job Credits or Asphalt Plant Job Credits, the Applicant shall annually, within 60 days of the end of each Year, provide to the Administrator a report in form and substance acceptable to the Administrator which calculates the Annual Job Credit or Annual Asphalt Plant Job Credits for the Year (the "Annual Report"). The Administrator shall have the right at any time to (i) require that the Annual Reports be reviewed at the Applicant's expense by a Certified Public Accountant reasonably acceptable to the Administrator, or (ii) hire, at the Administrator's own expense, an independent Certified Public Accountant or other Business or financial expert, to review the books and records of the Applicant pertaining to the Annual Report and any other terms and conditions as provided for in this Agreement. If after a review or audit of the Applicant's records it is discovered that the Annual Job Credit or Annual Asphalt Plant Job Credits claimed on the Annual Report exceeds 10% of the Annual Job Credit or Annual Asphalt Plant Job Credits as determined by the Administrator, then the Administrator may require the Applicant to reimburse the Fund for the actual cost of the audit.

12 Default:

The Applicant shall be in default in this Agreement and the Note if any of the following happen:

a. Failure to comply with any of the terms of this Agreement, the Note, or the Deed of Trust.

- b. Any warranty, representation, or statement made or given to the City by the Applicant proves to have been false in any material respect when made or given.
- c. Dissolution or liquidation of any of the Applicant, or insolvency, business failure, appointment of a receiver, assignment for the benefit of creditors, or bankruptcy of the Applicant.
- d. The Applicant ceases to conduct its Business (as defined above) or moves its Business (as defined above) outside of the Scotts Bluff County, Nebraska.
- e. Upon default, the Note shall accrue interest at the default rate of 7% per annum.

13. Assignability:

The Administrator may assign his interest in this Agreement to any successor administrator designated by the City Council. The Applicant may not assign or transfer its interest in this Agreement without the consent of the Administrator. Assignment shall include a transfer of ownership of the Applicant which results in the Kurt Croell, William Croell, and Joseph Croell, or their lineal issue, collectively owning less than 51% of the ownership interests of the Applicant.

14. Confidentiality:

It is agreed that this Agreement and its terms are public record and are not confidential. However, the City agrees to take reasonable steps to insure that any financial and proprietary information provided in connection with this Agreement by the Applicant shall remain confidential and shall not be revealed or disclosed to outside sources unless the information is public knowledge, is independently developed, or is required to be disclosed by law or legal process.

15. Notices:

a. Any notices or other communications between the parties shall be personally delivered, sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, by Federal Express or similar service that records delivery, to the addresses set out below, or to such other address as a party may designate, from time to time, by written notice to the other. A notice shall be deemed effective upon receipt.

- a. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with respect to its subject matter, and may only be modified by a writing signed by both of the parties.
- b. The City's waiver of any one default shall not be a waiver of the same or any other default in the future. In addition, the City's failure to exercise any right given to it by this Agreement shall not be a waiver of any later exercise of that right.
- c. The provisions of this Agreement are severable and if any provision is held to be invalid, the remainder of the Agreement shall remain in effect.
- d. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but which together shall constitute a single instrument.
- e. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of Nebraska.
- f. This Agreement shall be binding on the successors and assigns of the parties.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT dated _____, 2019 by and between the City of Scottsbluff, Nebraska, a Municipal Corporation, ("City") and Eric Reichert and Brandy Reichert, husband and wife, ("Reichert").

RECITALS:

- a. Reichert owns real estate which has recently been annexed within the City. The real estate is described as follows:

Lot 1, Block 1, Western Addition to the City of Scottsbluff, Scotts Bluff County, Nebraska which is situated in the SW¼SW¼ of Section 19, Township 22 North, Range 54 West of the 6th P.M., Scotts Bluff County, Nebraska ("Real Estate").
- b. Reichert intends to develop a convenience store/truck stop on the Real Estate.
- c. The City owns a stormwater detention facility located just east of the 27th Street and Highway 26 intersection and lying parallel to the northeast of Highway 26 ("Facility").
- d. The City has certain development requirements including post-construction stormwater management through Stormwater Treatment Facilities ("detention facility") as set forth in Chapter 24 of the Scottsbluff Municipal Code.
- e. The parties have determined it would be mutually beneficial and in each of the parties best interests to allow Reichert to excavate and remove soil and fill material ("material") from the Facility and then place the material on the Real Estate in lieu of constructing a detention facility on their Real Estate.

AGREEMENT:

1. **Obligation of Reichert:**
 - a. Reichert agrees to excavate and remove as much material from the Facility as is feasible without compromising the physical integrity of the Facility and to allow the proper operation and maintenance of the Facility. Reichert agrees to use the material only for placement on the Real Estate.
 - b. Reichert agrees to notify the City and to provide all traffic control necessary to enter and exit the Facility and Real Estate to safely excavate and transport the material. Reichert agrees to transport the material in a manner which will

cause minimal tract material on the streets of the City and Reichert will be responsible for the removal of any tract material on the streets as required, in a reasonable fashion. Reichert will also remove any tract material when requested by the City.

- c. Upon completing the excavation of material, Reichert agrees to leave the elevation and finish grade of the Facility in accordance with instruction from the City for seeding and to leave the Facility in good working order for the purpose of detaining and moving stormwater runoff.

2. **Obligation of City:**

- a. City agrees to permit Reichert to remove as much material from the Facility as is feasible without compromising the physical integrity, proper elevation, operation and maintenance of the Facility.
- b. City waives the requirement of a detention facility on the Real Estate developed by Reichert. Any permits required by Reichert which are conditioned upon a stormwater pollution prevention plan or a post-construction stormwater management plan will be issued by the City and the Reicherts will be allowed to develop the Real Estate without a detention facility, provided the elevations of the Real Estate are approved by the City.
- c. City agrees to stabilize and seed the disturbed areas of the Facility upon completion of the excavation of material by Reichert.
- d. City, upon notification by Reichert, agrees to complete a controlled burn of the Facility prior to excavation by Reichert.
- e. City agrees to provide geotechnical information to verify adequate soil and fill material are in the Facility prior to any excavation by Reichert.

3. **Term:** The parties agree all obligations and conditions in this Agreement will be met by _____, 2019. If the obligations or conditions have not been met by that date either party may, in its sole discretion, send written notice to the other party of their intent to terminate this Agreement. Upon written notification this Agreement will become null and void. The address to send written notification to each party is as follows:

4. **Indemnification and Insurance:** Reichert agrees to indemnify, protect and hold the City harmless from and against any and all liability, claims, losses, costs of investigation and defense, damaged property or bodily injury or death to any person, which may arise out of or be caused by the excavation of material and the transportation of material to the Real Estate. Reichert agrees to provide proof of liability insurance, sufficient in an amount solely within the discretion of the City, prior to beginning any excavation of material from the Facility.

5. **Independent Contractor:** Reichert will act as an independent contractor and not as an employee of the City. The City shall have no right to control the manner in which Reichert accomplishes the obligations of excavating material for their Real Estate. Reichert will provide all equipment, tools and machinery necessary to accomplish the excavation of material and agrees to carry out the obligations in a reasonable and timely fashion.

6. **General Provisions:**

- a. This Agreement and all rights hereunder may not be assigned by either party at any time.
- b. This Agreement may only be amended by a signed document from both parties.
- c. This Agreement will be interpreted according to the laws of the State of Nebraska.

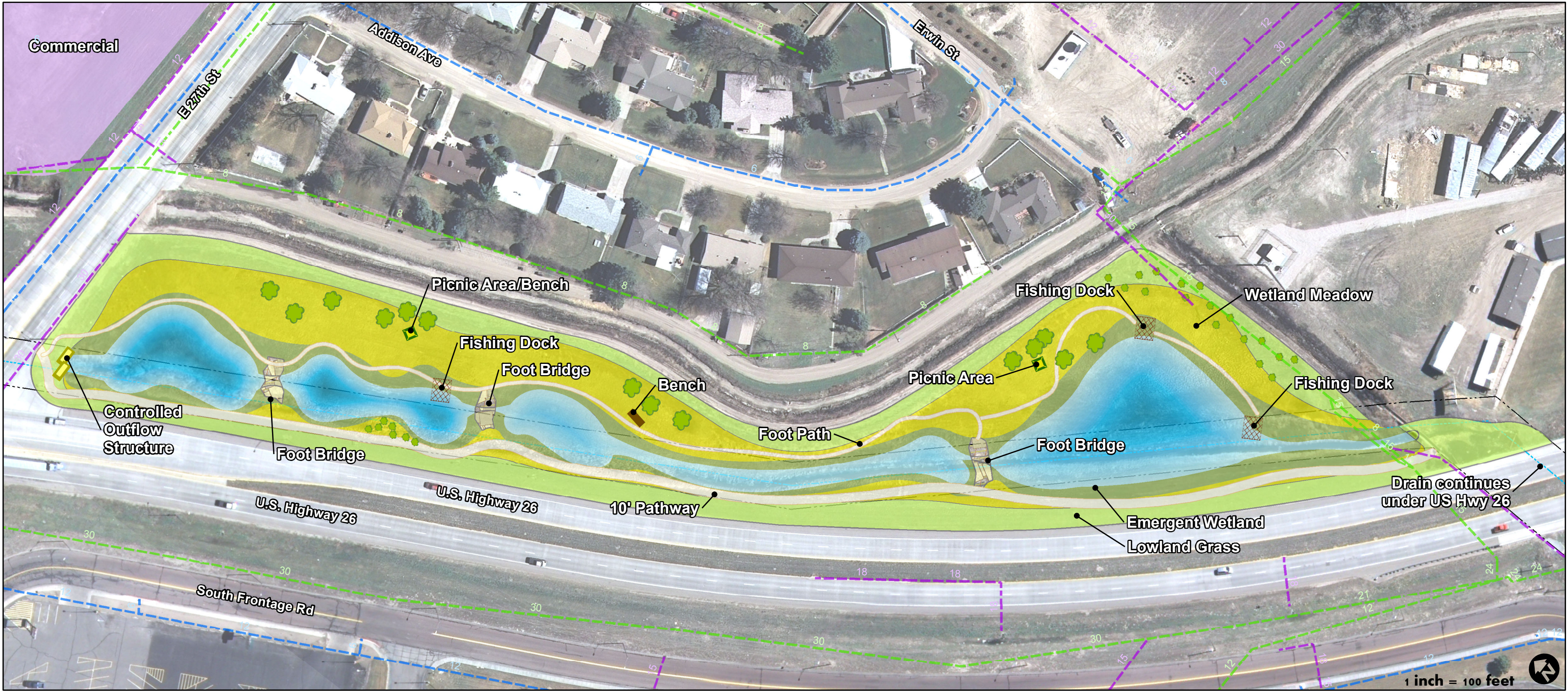

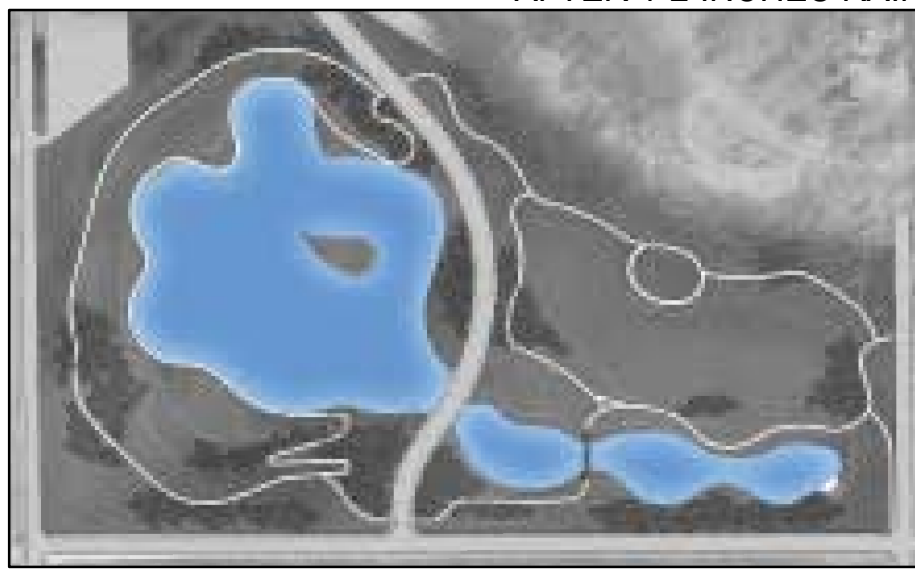

AGREEMENT FOR SERVICE AND CONSTRUCTION OF NEW LANDFILL

This Agreement is made on the 2nd day of July, 2007, by and between the City of Gering, a Municipal Corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "GERING") and the City of Scottsbluff, a Municipal Corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "SCOTTSDLUFF") under the Interlocal Cooperation Act.

WHEREAS, GERING agree to cooperate and contract with the City of Scottsbluff for the disposal of solid waste under the terms of the Integrated Solid Waste Management Act (Neb. Rev. Stat. § 13-2001 to 13-2043); and

WHEREAS, this Agreement is entered into pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 13-801 to 13-827, the Interlocal Cooperation Act, to enable the parties herein to comply with the mandates of the act and to provide for disposal of solid waste at the existing GERING Solid Waste Disposal site; and

WHEREAS, SCOTTSDLUFF desires to dispose of its waste at the existing GERING Municipal Solid Waste Disposal Site, GERING agrees to provide a site for municipal solid waste disposal for SCOTTSDLUFF; and

WHEREAS, GERING operates a waste disposal site known as the GERING Solid Waste Disposal Site hereinafter referred as the "Landfill" which is situated in GERING, Scotts Bluff County, Nebraska, and which has been designated by the State of Nebraska as a long-term Landfill for the City of GERING.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth herein, it is agreed by and between GERING and SCOTTSDLUFF as follows:

1. Approved Municipal Solid Waste. The GERING Landfill is available for the disposal of all approved solid waste. Approved solid waste shall mean all "municipal solid waste" as defined in the Integrated Solid Waste Management Act (Title 132) which is collected by SCOTTSDLUFF for the disposal of waste exclusively produced by SCOTTSDLUFF within their city limits and two mile jurisdictional boundary, subject to the following exclusions:

- (a) Any solid waste prohibited from Landfill disposal under State or Federal laws or regulations;
 - (b) Regulated hazardous waste and polychlorinated biphenyl waste (hereinafter referred to as PCB waste);
 - (c) Such other solid waste as GERING determines to be inappropriate for disposal at the Landfill; and
 - (d) A list of unacceptable waste will be posted at the facility.
2. Operation of Landfill and Duration. GERING agrees that the Landfill should be constructed, maintained and operated in accordance with all requirements of Federal and State law by GERING. GERING agrees that the Landfill shall accept approved municipal solid waste for disposal at its Landfill for the remaining life of the Landfill at its location near the west city limits of the City of GERING, more particularly described as follows:
- Part of the S½SE¼, Section 34, Township 22 North, Range 55 West of the 6th p.m., Scotts Bluff County, Nebraska, said site containing 38.52 acres more or less as described by Jensen survey of July 29, 1993 and recorded in landfill permit for Gering, Nebraska.
- Cells 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 remain unfilled at that Landfill. GERING shall start accepting waste pursuant to this Agreement on or about the 1st day of November, 2007. GERING shall be the designated owner of the Landfill, including all equipment, buildings and supplies.
3. Fees for Disposal. GERING will charge a fee for municipal solid waste disposal from SCOTTSBLUFF as follows:
- (a) Fees will be collected from Scottsbluff at the rate of \$37.50 per ton payable monthly based on scaled weight delivered to GERING plus CPI adjustments (see paragraph 3(d)). GERING will submit a statement to SCOTTSBLUFF which shall be paid within 28 days from the date of submission. In the event that the payment is not made within 28 days from the date of billing, interest on the unpaid balance will be due in the amount of 10%. From that \$37.50 per ton plus CPI (paragraph 3(d)), \$7.50 per ton is to be payable to the Reserve Account for the new landfill at that rate for the life of the landfill (see paragraph no. 10). These figures are based on the solid waste feasibility study:

- (b) GERING agrees that it will charge no less than \$37.50 per ton plus CPI adjustments (as defined in 3(d)) to any third party landfill users.
- (c) GERING agrees to operate its facility for the purpose of accommodating additional waste into GERING's existing Landfill.
- (d) Every year after the effective date of this Contract, for the contract term, the parties agree that the per ton charges to Scottsbluff in Paragraph 3(a) will be adjusted based upon the U.S. Department of Labor Consumer Price Index - Midwest Rural on that date. (i.e. on November 1st every year from November 1, 2007).
- (e) The fees collected by the City of GERING for the disposal of approved municipal solid waste shall include the following:
 - (1) All costs of operation of the Landfill and baler facility.
 - (2) All amounts payable for debt service, if any, in connection with financing to operate the facility;
 - (3) All amounts necessary to provide reserves for costs of closure and post-closure of facilities.
 - (4) All amounts necessary to provide for payment of Title 132 State Permit fees - Chapter 9, Annual Operating Fees - Chapter 10, and Municipal Solid Waste Disposal Fees - Chapter 11 (currently \$1.25 per ton); provided however that if these fees are increased by the State, SCOTTSBLUFF and GERING will share on a cumulative annual tonnage basis any increase in fees above current charges by the State of Nebraska, as of the effective date of the contract. Payments should be made 28 days from date of submission.

- (f) Roll off and Compactors: GERING will provide SCOTTSBLUFF customers with roll offs and compactors exclusively within the SCOTTSBLUFF zoning jurisdiction subject to existing contract rights with others. SCOTTSBLUFF agrees to give notice to Waste Connection of termination of its contract for roll off and compactors, dated April 18, 2005. GERING and SCOTTSBLUFF will provide notice to Waste Connection of GERING's intent to serve SCOTTSBLUFF by resolution in July, 2007. Waste Connection will be provided the option to serve SCOTTSBLUFF for one additional year from the date of GERING's resolution to provide service to SCOTTSBLUFF for roll off waste collection pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 18-1752.02. In the event Waste Connection agrees to provide roll off and compactor service for one additional year pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 18-1752.02, the final date of service by Waste Connection shall be twelve (12) months from the date of the resolution by GERING. Thereafter, GERING will exclusively provide SCOTTSBLUFF with roll off and compactor service for the term of GERING's contract with SCOTTSBLUFF (life of the GERING landfill).

GERING will charge a landfill fee and a collection fee. Landfill fees will be charged at the rate of \$37.50 per ton subject to CPI (3(d) above). Collection fees will be set annually by GERING and include operations and capital costs. GERING will charge sales tax in addition to these fees.

- (g) White goods, Tires and Other Prohibited Materials: GERING will receive all white goods, tires and other prohibited materials from SCOTTSBLUFF (including GERING'S) at the landfill. All white goods, tires, and prohibited waste/materials received at GERING'S landfill will be disposed of by GERING. GERING will send a bill to SCOTTSBLUFF for the cost of disposal of all white goods, tires and other prohibited materials received in the landfill from SCOTTSBLUFF.
4. Delivery of Waste to the Landfill. SCOTTSBLUFF is responsible for delivery of all of its municipal solid waste to the GERING Landfill site, except rolloff and compactors which SCOTTSBLUFF grants an exclusive right to the City of Gering to serve, subject to provisions of 3(f) above.
5. Unanticipated State and Federal Mandates. In the event that there are any State or Federal Mandates requiring additional expenditure for fees, equipment, real estate and other Landfill requirements, which do not exist on the date of execution of this contract, the parties agree to share any additional cost on a cumulative annual tonnage basis as of November 1st each year, or each year and the date of said expenditure, whichever first occurs. Payments should be made 28 days from date of submission.
6. Regulation of Waste Received. GERING will regulate all solid waste to be received by the Landfill. It shall be the responsibility of SCOTTSBLUFF to insure that City of

Scottsbluff personnel have sufficient training and knowledge to recognize unacceptable wastes, including hazardous and PCB waste, and to insure that such materials are not delivered to the Landfill. SCOTTSBLUFF shall use its best efforts consistent with current levels of training and monitoring by its collection staff to recognize unacceptable wastes, including hazardous and PCB waste. All loads delivered to the Landfill will be subject to inspection for waste content; any unauthorized items will be rejected, and for the first 6 months inventoried so the parties may negotiate a cost or other consideration for GERING to handle these items. This contract does not cover individual citizen's disposal of solid waste. GERING reserves the right to accept or not accept waste delivered by individuals delivered to the GERING landfill in cars, pickups, or other vehicles at rates to be set by GERING.

7. Hours of operation: Hours of operation are subject to change in GERING's discretion. Landfill and baler hours of operation are currently:

LANDFILL

6:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. for the purpose of receiving loads.

BALER

6:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Days of operation: Monday through Friday.

8. Compost: SCOTTSBLUFF shall provide grass and leaves collection for all SCOTTSBLUFF customers and compost its own material. GERING composts grass and other compost type materials through a separate collection system. GERING will be allowed to use SCOTTSBLUFF's composting facility in GERING's discretion at no fee. GERING residents and Gering municipal services will be able to use this composted waste.
9. Spring Clean Up: The parties agree that SCOTTSBLUFF and GERING residents will be allowed a minimum of 5 days free landfill for residential customers only (not commercial) in the sole discretion of Gering. Residents will be required to show proof of residence within the city of SCOTTSBLUFF by driver's license and a City of Scottsbluff utility bill. The dates and times for these clean-ups will be determined by GERING. In addition, the parties will agree on a date certain for the Southeast Scottsbluff cleanup program under the same terms and conditions.
10. Reserve Account for New Landfill Site: SCOTTSBLUFF and GERING agree that for the term of this agreement (life of the GERING landfill), each community shall contribute \$7.50 per ton into a separate reserve interest bearing account which shall be non-refundable to each city. Gering agrees to make Scottsbluff's contribution from the \$37.50 fee provided at 3(a). The intent of this agreement is for Gering and Scottsbluff to partner in a new landfill at a different location, and accumulate and invest money to site

and construct the same. If either of the parties of this agreement do not participate in the joint effort to site and build a new landfill, all Reserve Account money through the life of the current GERING landfill will remain in the new landfill Reserve Account, and the non-participating city shall forfeit all money contributed into that Reserve Account through the end of the term of this agreement (life of current landfill). In the event neither City goes forward with the landfill, the funds accumulated from third party cities or third party independent haulers will be Gering's funds. The funds contributed by Gering and Scottsbluff will be divided by them based on each City's contribution per ton. The purpose of this account will be to locate and construct a new Landfill which shall meet State and Federal requirements for a municipal solid waste facility. These funds shall be audited annually. The operation of the new joint Landfill will be the subject of an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between GERING, SCOTTSBLUFF or any other community or entity specifically allowed only by the agreement of SCOTTSBLUFF and GERING to participate. In the event GERING chooses to permit third party cities or third party independent haulers to use the existing Landfill, those third party cities / haulers will be charged no less than \$7.50 per ton, all final charges of which will be determined by GERING. Third party Reserve Account fees will be deposited into the new landfill Reserve Account. GERING and SCOTTSBLUFF agree to invest such public funds in this Reserve Account consistent and in accordance with Nebraska law.

If GERING and SCOTTSBLUFF both agree, in writing, to not jointly build a new landfill, both communities shall be entitled to their respective capital contributions based upon fees paid and interest accrued on an agreed final date of distribution.

11. City of Mitchell: The City of Gering currently has a contract for hauling and disposal of Mitchell's municipal waste. The GERING-SCOTTSBLUFF contract herein is subject to the terms and conditions of the Gering - Mitchell contract for the existing term of the Gering-Mitchell contract. (Gering - Mitchell contract term is 02/01/2005 to 01/31/2010) The City of Mitchell tonnage received by GERING through the term of the existing contract with Mitchell shall be itemized and excluded from the \$7.50 / ton Reserve Account fee until midnight on January 31, 2010. Upon renewal, GERING will insure that Mitchell's fee includes at a minimum the \$7.50 per ton charge as set forth in paragraph 10.
12. Default: In the event that either GERING or SCOTTSBLUFF defaults in any of the provisions of this agreement, either party may resort to any remedy available under Nebraska law.
13. Assignability: Neither party may assign its interest in this Agreement to any other entity without the express written consent of the other.
14. Notices: Any notices or other communications between the parties shall be personally delivered, sent by regular mail, or by facsimile transmission, electronic mail, or by facsimile transmission combined with any of the above methods of service, to the addresses set out below, or to such other address as a party may designate, from time-to-time, by written notice to the other. A notice shall be deemed effective upon receipt.

15. Miscellaneous:

- (a) This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with respect to its subject matter, and may only be modified in writing signed by both of the parties.
- (b) Either City's waiver of any one default shall not be a waiver of the same or any other default in the future. In addition, either City's failure to exercise any right given to it by this Agreement shall not be a waiver of any later exercise of that right.
- (c) The provisions of this Agreement are severable and if any provision is held to be invalid, the remainder of the Agreement shall remain in effect.
- (d) This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but which together shall constitute a single instrument.
- (e) This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of Nebraska.
- (f) This Agreement shall be binding on the successors and assigns of the parties.
- (g) SCOTTSBLUFF may not assign or transfer their interest in this Agreement without the consent of GERING.
- (h) In the event of disagreement or dispute concerning any of the terms of this contract, GERING and SCOTTSBLUFF agree to negotiate and work toward resolving any such disputes or disagreements in good faith.

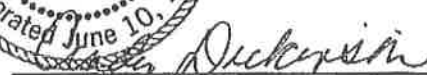

ADDENDUM

Comes now the City of Scottsbluff and the City of Gering, parties to the contract dated July 7, 2007 wherein the parties agreed that the City of Gering would dispose of City of Scottsbluff's solid waste.

A need for clarification has arisen with regard to paragraph 3f that provides for the City of Gering to take over the roll-off and compactor business from the City of Scottsbluff.

Notwithstanding any interpretation of the above described clause or any other provision of the contract with regard to what was meant by the parties in the roll-off and compactor language, the parties agree to the following:

- (1) The City of Gering will take over and provide service to businesses and/or citizens in the City of Scottsbluff for the purpose of providing them roll-offs and compactors. Scottsbluff agrees that it will not during the term of this contract provide such service.
- (2) In the above described service agreement, the City of Gering will set the rates for the services provided the businesses and/or citizens in Scottsbluff.
- (3) The City of Gering will deliver and pick-up the roll-offs and compactors as requested by such customers.
- (4) The City of Gering will process and send billings to City of Scottsbluff businesses and/or other citizens who use City of Gering services for roll-offs and compactors.

Parties agree that all other provisions of the above described contract are confirmed and ratified.

This agreement shall be considered effective July 7, 2008 and will continue for the duration of the contract described above between the parties.

This addendum shall be binding upon the parties, their successors and assignees. Parties agree that this addendum shall be attached to the above described contract and considered a part thereof.

On November 5, 2018 the City of Scottsbluff received three bids from two companies in response to the Request for Proposal (RFP) for Sanitation Services. The RFP was approved by City Council on September 4, 2018 and advertised on September 7, 2018; September 14, 2018; September 21, 2018. Bids submittals were due by 10:00am on November 5, 2018 in the City Clerk's Office. The RFP allowed for interested companies to bid on two scopes (Scope A and/or Scope B).

Scope A

One bid was received from Waste Connections in response to Scope A. Scope A allowed for bidders to submit a price on privatizing the entire sanitation services. The bidding entity would be responsible for collection from the individual residence or commercial entity for trash, recycling and yard waste. Below is a breakdown of the bid received as compared to the City's current charges.

Scope A also does not include any revenue for the Compost Facility operations which is currently split between the Environmental Services and Wastewater funds.

It should also be noted that Waste Connections is willing to purchase existing equipment, materials and lease the existing building. Waste Connections is also interested in hiring all of the current Environmental Services employees.

Scope B

Two Bids were received from Waste Connections and TDS Collection Service, Inc in response to Scope B. Scope B allowed for the City to keep the current collection process and then take the trash to a transfer point (i.e. landfill, transfer station, etc.). Neither of these bids included a price for recycling.

TDS would need to construct a transfer station to handle the City's trash. TDS has offered that a transfer station be built on approximately 65 acres at the Compost facility in exchange for the City being a 10% partner on the facility. This opportunity is subject to negotiation.

TDS is also willing to share revenue on the 30 cubic yard roll off boxes that is equivalent to \$35.00 per roll off container. There is approximately 120 roll offs per year currently being serviced in the City by the City of Gering. This equates to approximately \$4,200 in additional revenue per year.

Recycling Disposal

Current (City of Gering):

\$24.65 per ton tipping fee x 210 tons = **\$5,176.50 per year**

Proposed (Waste Connections):

\$32.00 per ton tipping and transportation to Cheyenne, WY x 210 tons = \$6,720

Plus \$40 to \$45 tipping fee at Wyco x 210 tons = \$8,400 to \$9,450

Total: \$15,120 to \$16,170 per year

The approximate cost to Wyco is if they are willing to accept the single stream recycling. There is a chance that they will decide not to take it and we will have to look elsewhere for recycling disposal.

Conclusion

The information provided is for information only. City staff will give a recommendation after further discussions with Waste Connections and also the completion of Tri-Hydro's Phase 1 Site Assessment/Investigation.
