The Seward City Council met at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 1, 2016, with Mayor Joshua Eickmeier presiding and Assistant Administrator /Clerk-Treasurer /Budget & Human Resources Director Bonnie Otte recording the proceedings. 5. CONSIDERATION OF AN ORDINANCE DIRECTING THE CONVEYANCE OF REAL PROPERTY TO THE STATE OF NEBRASKA FOR NATIONAL GUARD MUSEUM

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Ordinance No. 2016-10 approving the conveyance of real property to the State of Nebraska for National Guard Museum was adopted.

6. CONSIDERATION OF AGREEMENT WITH SCHEMMER ASSOCIATES FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES RELATED OT THE WAVERLY ROAD DESIGN, HWY 15 TO KAROL KAY BOULEVARD

Schemmer Associates, Doug Holle, P.E., addressed the City Council regarding engineering services for the Waverly Road, Highway 15 to Karol Kay Boulevard project. He stated Schemmer is contracted for the Seward Trail design and since part of the proposed trail lies along Waverly Rd east of Hwy 15, and it is in the City's future plans to improve Waverly Road, it seemed appropriate to propose an agreement for professional services for the Waverly Road design from Hwy 15 to Karol Kay Blvd. The agreement includes survey, roadway design, and right-of-way design. He stated the design work should be complete by the end of 2016. The Trail project is scheduled for 2018/2019 construction, so construction of the Waverly Road project could be planned for 2017 or early 2018. He stated the County may be looking at making improvements to the east of this point and they will make every effort to coordinate the construction with the County.

There was brief discussion about how the project would affect the homeowners in the area (land acquisition) and how it may affect the infrastructure that is already in place to the north of Waverly Rd. John Hughes stated the current water lines are to the north of this road at a distance that should not be affected by the Waverly Road improvements. Mr. Holle stated that until the design work begins, it is difficult to determine the effect on the homeowners; however, other than obtaining right-of-way easements, he did not feel land acquisition would be required.

Water/Wastewater Director Tim Richtig addressed the City Council and stated that any further development to the north would need new sewer lines, which would need to be under Waverly Road or moved to the north, with the likelihood of a lift station.

Mike Luebbe, Seward County Commissioner stated the County is interested in making improvements from Karol Kay Blvd to Rd 238, but he was not speaking for the Commission and didn't know the timeline for these improvements.

Councilmember Kamprath requested references and information on projects completed by Schemmer Associates since they had not done this type of professional service for road construction work for the City of Seward in the past.

Mr. Holle stated the firm has completed multiple projects for First Class cities and has completed several urban widening projects for other communities. Mr. Holle stated he would be happy to provide the City with references.

Councilmember Kamprath moved, seconded by Councilmember Fritz, that the agreement with Schemmer Associates for Professional Services related to the Waverly Road design, Hwy 15 to Karol Kay Boulevard, be approved, contingent upon receiving the reference information from Schemmer Associates on prior projects.

8. PRESENTATION BY BLUESTEM ENERGY SOLUTIONS ON RENEWABLE ENERGY/WIND TURBINE AND DISCUSSION OF POWER SUPPLY AGREEMENT

Bluestem Energy Solutions, Adam Herink and Matt Robinette provided an overview of the activities completed to this point, per the Developer's Agreement signed in June of 2015 on the potential of constructing a wind turbine within the area. He stated the company completed a wind assessment of the area, distribution analysis, landowner negotiations/signing of a lease agreement, environmental assessment, shadow/flicker & noise studies, budgeting pricing, and Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act Qualifying Facility preview. The proposal is to construct a 1.7 MW General Electric Turbine, located approximately 4.5 miles west of the City south of McKelvie Rd. The turbine would be interconnected into the City's distribution system at the Walker Substation. This would be under a 25-year fixed price contract. Mr. Herink stated they reviewed the City and County zoning regulations and believe they can meet all of the requirements. He stated there are no upfront costs (other than a meter) or future costs to the City for the construction or maintenance of the turbine, which means no additional debt to the City. The wind energy turbine would provide Green attributes for corporate recruitment, additional property tax revenue for Seward County, additional sales tax revenue and educational opportunities for local schools. Mr. Herink stated the Nebraska Tax Credits are currently available and once a project is constructed, they retain the tax credits as long as there is a project, even if the credits are eliminated. He stated they will have to complete a study and make application with Nebraska Public Power District to make sure the project will be approved. He stated that after 25 years, the City can choose to renew the agreement (minor upgrades to the turbine), or not renew it and the turbine will be dismantled at Bluestem's costs, including a portion of the concrete pad (returning the property to tillable land). He stated they will be applying for a permit through the County for the turbine. He stated the one turbine should not affect crop spraying for the leased land and the turbine could be shut down to accommodate the spraying, if needed.

Councilmember Schmit moved, seconded by Councilmember Singleton, that the City Council enter into executive closed session for the protection of the public interest and for the purpose of discussing confidential and proprietary rate information presented by Bluestem Energy Solutions with the Mayor, City Attorney, City Administrator, Adam Herink and Matt Robinette, for a period not to exceed 30 minutes.

Mayor Eickmeier stated a motion has been made and seconded to go into executive closed session for the purpose of discussing confidential and proprietary rate information presented by Bluestem Energy Solutions, to include the Mayor, City Attorney, City Administrator, Adam Herink and Matt Robinette, for a period not to exceed 30 minutes.

9. CONSIDERATION OF AN AGREEMENT WITH EARTH NETWORKS, INC FOR PLACEMENT OF A WEATHER CAMERA, WEATHER STATION, AND RELATED HARDWARE AND SOFTWARE ON THE WATER TOWER

Water/Wastewater Director Tim Richtig presented an agreement with Earth Networks, Inc for placement of a weather camera, weather station, and related hardware and software on the small downtown water tower. He stated Earth Networks partners with Channel 8 and would provide live feeds from the City. The camera would be directed toward the County Courthouse and would provide a nice view of the downtown. The City would provide the electricity for the equipment at a minimal cost. He stated it is a one-year agreement. Earth Networks will not be paying a fee for the use of the tower; however, the live feed will be a nice promotional tool for the community.

Councilmember Singleton moved, seconded by Councilmember Pike, that the agreement with Earth Networks, Inc for placement of a weather camera, weather station, and related hardware and software on the water tower be approved.
