The Seward City Council met at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 7, 2016, with Mayor Joshua Eickmeier presiding and Assistant Administrator /Clerk-Treasurer /Budget & Human Resources Director Bonnie Otte recording the proceedings. PROJECT UPDATE AND DISCUSSION REGARDING THE PROPOSED BLUE RIVER PET RESCUE ANIMAL SHELTER

Dr. Dan Ellis, 1187 Augusta Dr., addressed the City Council updating them on the progress so far in a proposal to build and operate the Blue River Pet Rescue Animal Shelter. He stated he met with the Seward County Commissioners and it appears there is interest in pursuing the project. Based on a prior meeting with the City Council and with the Commissioners, it appears the government interest is with year-to-year financial support rather than continued operational support, however; no level of support has been determined. He stated Blue River has a \$100,000 matching donation for construction of the estimated \$600,000 facility and they have obtained \$30,000 in private donations. He stated they have the lot purchased, but just recently found a building that may work as a shelter with some remodeling. They are planning a fund drive and will also be seeking grant dollars to reach the goal for construction. He said they are requesting a combined \$50,000 from the City and County. They will also be requesting an additional combined \$10,000 support from each of the communities within the County (total of \$60,000). He stated the next step is for the City and County to determine the type of support they would provide and the partnership arrangement. He said they would like to have some direction within the next three to four months.

City Administrator Smith stated the City currently budgets \$5,000 for strays taken to the Staplehurst Veterinary impound. The current arrangement is not an animal rescue. He said the Police Department is having good luck using social media and locating owner's animals, limiting the number taken to the impound. No action was taken.

8. CONSIDERATION SPECIAL DESIGNATED LIQUOR PERMIT FOR BOTTLE ROCKET BREWING, LLC, 230 S 5^{TH} STREET, FOR AN OUTDOOR BEER GARDEN ON JULY 1 THROUGH JULY 5

Gerald Homp, Bottle Rocket Brewing, LLC, President, addressed the City Council stating that the agenda item lists the Special Designated Liquor Permit request for an "outdoor" beer garden. He stated the request is partially outdoor, but will also include the large addition in the back, which is currently under construction and to be completed enough to get an occupancy permit.

Councilmember Hans moved, seconded by Councilmember Singleton, that the Special Designated Liquor permit for Bottle Rocket Brewing, LLC, 230 S 5^{th} Street for a beer garden on July 1 through July 5, 2016, to be located on their private property located at 230 S 5^{th} Street, be approved.

9. CONSIDERATION OF POTENTIAL ACQUISITION OF TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT CONSTRUCTION AND GRADING EASEMENT FROM SEWARD SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR REAL ESTATE LOCATED WEST OF STAR STREET

Dr. Greg Barnes, Seward Public Schools Superintendent, 1611 Augusta Dr., addressed the City Council stating the Seward Public School Board is interested in working with the homeowners on Star Street and with the City; however, the Board has not taken any official action on this item. The School Board is interested in a permanent easement, but not sure of a temporary easement due to the potential for responsibility of the project into the future. The School Board would be willing to mow the swale, if that is what is proposed, but does not want the responsibility of liability should there be a "blow-out" or if there is future flooding. He said the School Board is interested in hiring an engineer and paying the costs and deciding later if this could be handled through a temporary or permanent easement. If the City decides to not follow the engineer's recommendation, then the City would reimburse the Seward Public Schools for the engineering costs. He said the School Board feels there needs to be a decision if the City is interested in moving forward with the engineering.

Dr. Barnes stated the Seward Public Schools owns the ground where the project is proposed; however, the School owned this ground prior to the installation of Star Street.
