The South Central Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) program began in 2011. The counties involved include: Blue Earth, Brown, Cottonwood, Faribault, Jackson, Le Sueur, Martin, Nicollet, Nobles, Rock, Sibley, Waseca and Watonwan.

The South Central Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths program is led by a Steering Committee comprised of the "4 Es:"

- Enforcement
- Engineering
- Education

South Central Traffic Information

The leading cause of deaths and severe injuries in south central Minnesota include:

- Lack of Seatbelt Use
 - 2015 South Central Minnesota regional seat belt usage survey results: **86.7** percent (up 2.1percent from the 2014 rate)
- Impaired Driving
- Speed and Aggressive Driving
- Inattentive Driving

South Central Minnesota Fatals and Serious Injuries by County (2010-2014)

The leading type of crash resulting in deaths and severe injuries include:

- * Run-off-Road
- * Intersection-Related



To reduce fatalities and serious injuries on Minnesota's roads to zero










South Central Regional Seat Belt Use (2011-2015)

In 2015, the regional seat belt compliance rate increased slightly from 84.6% in 2014 to 86.7%.






2010-2014 Fatalities






2010-2014 Serious Injuries



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


2014 Fatalities






2014 Serious Injuries



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


5-year Progress in Fatalities






5-year Progress in Serious Injuries



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

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Key Findings for 2014

South Central Region

- Males ages 15-24 are overrepresented in serious injury and fatal crashes.
- 2.8 fatalities per month
- 6.1 serious injuries per month
- Alcohol-, speed- and unbelted-related crashes are decreasing.

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Key Findings for 2014

Successes!

- 1 County with ZERO fatalities
- 1 County with ONE serious injury

As of March 21, 2016, there were XX traffic-related deaths on Minnesota roads, compared to XX deaths at this time last year.












Looking Forward Toward Zero Deaths Goal
